A number of bids were made for the bonds, but most of them demanded that the entre amount be included in the sale and none of them offered as much as did the home Bank Under the terms of the गत anc agreement the Bank takes $\$ 6000.00$ of the bonds now, which will give the city sufficient funds to sink a deep wsll and make the necessary investigation relative to secu:ting a sufficien supply of water for tie system to be installed. If there is not enough water obtainable to justify the water works system being put in, there will be no obliga. tion of the city to deliver the remainder of the bonds, therefore, the $e^{3}$ ty whel not have any more indebt. edness than nesessary.
