From the Fort Worth Star-Telegram. special to the Eagle;

Following numbers have been drawn in the federal draft, which was made at Washington yesterday. These numbers correspond with the names given, as shown by the exemption board's list on the bulletin board at the court house. Those drawn will have five days after being officially notified to appear for physical examination and five more days in which to file their claims for exemption. It is not likely they will be called into training camps before September.

The entire list of ten million registered men was drawn and will be called out in the order drawn. This county's quota will be 55 and the following is a list of the first 188 as drawn. There may be a few errors and omissions in the list here given, due to the hurry of transmission and handling, but the Eagle believes it to be correct; however, we can not guarantee its absolute accuracy:




