#### THE COMPULSORY AITEND-ANCE LAW

In view of the fact that schools re beginning to open and many patrons, who have not had chance to become acquainted with the compalsory law, are asking about it, I take this method of bringing before the cople some of the main provisons of the law so that it be understood better.

The law provides that children eight to fourteen years of age shall attend school and for the term of 1917-18 a period of ghty days or four mouths. The ompulsory period shall begin at the lopening of school unless otherwise authorized by tees are to give notice when said period starts, provided they do not put it off until the eighty days cannot be gotten in.
