





Retailers are permitted to sell onsumers a thirty day supply of Clour , basing such sales on an allowance of six pounds per pers n per month, provided said ix pounds is not in excess of 70 per cent of consumer's normal equirements.

Retailers, as far as possible, hould confine their sales to their regular customers, and must satisfy themselves as to the num-Well Drill-For well drilling ber of persons supplied by the individual purchaser. Retailers ere required to keep a record or their flour sales, which record r presentatives of the U.S. Food Administration at all times.


