BELL COUNTY FARMERS ENLIST IN AMERICAN FARM BUREAU

Belton, Texas, Sept. 1 .- More than five hundred farmers are pledged to the Bell County Farm Bureau which has completed a three days drive in a small portion of the county, eighty per cent of all farmers solicited having joined the organization which now has nearly a million and a half members in 31 states of the union and in more than

half the counties in the United States. The Bell county drive is to continue for several weeks until every farmer is seen and if the present percentage is kept up the final membership will be in

the neighborhood of 2,500 members. Texas farmers have already been saved millions of dollars through the American Farm Bureau's defeat of the Nolan bill, which would have taxed all farm values over \$10,000 one per cent annually. Bell county farmers regard the \$10 membership fee as a small item. compared with the benefit already received. For example, it is stated that a man owning a farm valued at \$40,000 would have had to have paid \$300 extra tax a year if the American Farm Bureau had not stepped in with its million and more members and defeated the bill while it was before congress.

It is stated that this same bill is coming before congress again and that the Farm Bureau is going to have another fight to defeat it for all time. The Bell county farmers are lining up almost one hundred per cent with the Farm Bureau to get the benefit of the organization in fighting those measures which mean loss of money to the farming

John Orr, a farmer in Dallas county, is the president of the Texas Farm Bureau, and C. O. Moser is the secretary. Both men expect to make the Texas organization second to none in the United States.




