



Georgetown, Texas, Oct. 12 .- With more than a thousand farmers airead; members of the Williamson County Farm Bureau and the campaign jus half over, farmers around Georgetowi today opened the drive in the George town district.

Farmers around Taylor have 600 already and promise that a thousand will join in that section of the county The Granger district is claiming : better enrollment than that of Taylor. whole communities having come in en masse signing up for farm bureau mem berships.

AUGUST 31, 1895.

On Thursday the first bale of Mills county cotton was brought in by B. D. hapman and sold to G. E. Brown & Co. for \$7.55 per hundred, which was more than the market quotations,

Shot by the Sheriff .- Joe Allen, wanted in Goldthwaite to answer to the charge of assault and battery, was shot and killed by Sheriff Wren of Lampasas Monday morning. Allen engaged in a difficulty here several weeks ago and after pounding his adversary up considerably made his esape, and officers have been looking for him since. Sheriff Wren met Alen and a man who claimed to be his brother and remarked to Allen that he had papers for him when both the me drew their pistols and fired on the ficer, their bullets going wide of tue mark. The sheriff then drew his own weapon and shot Allen twice. He was taken to jail, where he died.

Shot Himself .- On last Friday morning about 8 o'clock Flavell Griggs, son of A. H. Griggs, of Center City, killed himself. Upon examination it was ascertained that the young man loaded his gun the night before and leaning it up in the corner of the house remarked, "That will blow my head off." Next morning he took the gun to the cowpen. He tied the butt of the gun to a stake of the rail fence, tied a string to the trigger and arranged it so by pulling the string from the front he would fire the gun. He then deliberately picked up the muzzle of the gun, held it to his breast and pulled the string, the entire load entering his body, part of it going clean through.



### WHAT IS COTTON WORTH?

The following is given out by the State Department of Agriculture:

Is it worth as much as it costs to produce cotton? Yes, and then some. Can the farmers get cost and a profit? Yes, if they try.

Please remember that the speculators and spinners said in 1917, that cotton would only be worth 10 to 15 cents. The Department of Agriculture of Texas, and other cotton states, said it was worth 30 cents, and urged the farmers to hold for it. Those who held for

The cost in 1918 was 35 cents, which was \$85 per bale more than cotton was selling for in September, when picking urged to hold for 35 cents, and many did. In about 30 days cotton was selling for 35 cents.

The cost in 1919 was 44 cents, and the price recommended by the State Department was 45 cents, which was \$90 per bale more than cotton had been selling for. Again the farmers were urged to hold for the price. By November 1st, good cotton in West Texas sold as high as 45 cents.

The 1920 crop cost 46 cents, and the farmers are asked to hold for 48 cents, which is about \$90 per bale more than it is selling for, Will the price advance to 48 cents? It will if many farmers refuse to sell as in the other three years. More will hold for the

Every phase of supply and demand is in the farmers' favor this 'year, as compared with the other three years. Farmer, merchant, banker, will you be benefited if the farmer gets \$90 namaker, president of the American or \$100 more per bale for his cotton? It is for you to decide. Then act by putting your heads together to see from the market.

CITY ORDINANCE.

An Ordinance amending an amended Ordinance of the City of Goldthwaite, Texas, the original of which is found on page 32 of the Code of Ordinances of said City, and the original amendment of which is found on page 74 of the Code of Ordinances of said City, entitled: "An Ordinance of the City of Goldthwaite, Texas, prescribing that certain persons shall work on the public roads, streets and alleys of the said City, or furnish a substitute, the number of days work required, the manner of performing such duty, the number of hours per day, the manner of securing exemptions from such work, prescribing under whose direction same shall be performed, and who shall collect and report road tax, defining who are overseers, their powers and duties, and prescribing a penalty.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GOLD-THWAITE, TEXAS,-

That Art, 5 of the above entitled Ordinance, as adopted by the City Council of the said City on January 10, 1916, and amended by said City Council on the first day of December, A. D. 1919, be further amended so that hereafter the same shall read as fol-

Art. 5. Any person liable to work on the roads, streets, and alleys of the city under the provisions of this Ordinance, who shall on or before the 1st day of February, of any year, pay to of Goldthwaite, Texas, the sum of FIVE (\$5.00) DOLLARS, shall be exempt from performing such duty for such year, beginning on the first day of February, and ending on the 31st day of January of the ensuing year. The Tax Collector shall receive and receipt for all money so paid to him, and shall separately report same, together with the names of the persons paying, to the City Treasurer, who shall place said sums of money to the Street Fund of said city. The Tax Collector shall also, on the 3rd day of February, or as soon thereafter as practicable, furnish to the overseer a copy of his aforesaid report.

The foregoing amendment of the above entitled ordinance unanimously passed by the City Council in regular session, on the 7th day of October, A. D. 1920, all members being present, and voting, and the rule requiring ordinances to be read three several times being unanimously suspended, the ordinance was passed to its third and last reading; was approved by the Mayor on the 8th day of October, A. D. 1920, and ordered filed in the office of the City Secretary, to be in full force and effect immediately after its passage and publication.




