W. F. HEARNE DEAD

On January 12th, William Fletcher Hearne was found dead in his room at San Diego, California. He was alone at the time and apparently died in sleep.

Mr. Hearne was a native of Ala bama, 85 years old, but had lived in Texas nearly 70 years. He was for a time a plantation overseer of a Brazos river plantation, the proptery of his uncle Dougle McAlpine. He saw much service during the Civil War, mostly on coast guard duty, and assisted in the recapture of Galveston.

After the war he acted as immigration Agent for a time bringing many good families from Alabama to Texas. For a few years, he engaged in farming and stock engaged in merchandising, but as the Santa Fe railway was extend- Texas. ing out from Lampasas in 1885, he brought his family to Goldthwaite in July of that year, living for a time in a tent as no homes could be erected prior to lot sale.

He was active and energetic in doing the many things necessary to be done in establising a new town. Roads were to be opened, churches and schools built, a new county to be created, in all of which Bill Hearne's hands and lighter than rubber. It conducts their full share. He made a trip to Austin at his own expense to urge the Legislature to grant us a new county government, and it was largely due to his efforts that the measure prevailed.

He permitted the Odd Fellows Cemetry to be located upon his land, the W. F. Hearne survey, and was one of the petitioners for a Masonic lodge and he became a charter member when the lodge
