

W. F. HEARNE DEAD

On January 12th, William Fletcher Hearne was found dead in his room at San Diego, California. He was alone at the time and apparently died in sleep.

Mr. Hearne was a native of Alabama, 85 years old, but had lived in Texas nearly 70 years. He was for a time a plantation overseer of a Brazos river plantation, the property of his uncle Dougle McAlpine. He saw much service during the Civil War, mostly on coast guard duty, and assisted in the recapture of Galveston.

After the war he acted as immigration Agent for a time bringing many good families from Alabama to Texas. For a few years he engaged in farming and stock raising in Grimes County, where he married Kate Caldwell in 1873. In 1883 he moved to San Saba and engaged in merchandising, but as the Santa Fe railway was extending out from Lampasas in 1885, he brought his family to Goldthwaite in July of that year, living for a time in a tent as no homes could be erected prior to lot sale.

He was active and energetic in doing the many things necessary to be done in establishing a new town. Roads were to be opened, churches and schools built, a new county to be created, in all of which Bill Hearne's hands and his purse were ready, and did their full share. He made a trip to Austin at his own expense to urge the Legislature to grant us a new county government, and it was largely due to his efforts that the measure prevailed.

He permitted the Odd Fellows Cemetery to be located upon his land, the W. F. Hearne survey, and was one of the petitioners for a Masonic lodge and he became a charter member when the lodge was organized.

Surviving him are four daughters, Mrs. W. C. Crane of Franklin, Mrs. Knox Gilmore of Houston, Mrs. Jack Kennedy of Scottsdale, Arizona, and Mrs. Cris Cosgrove of San Diego, California.

He is survived also by seven sons, Maury of Yoakum, Dr. Rodney of Seattle Washington, Drs. Euel and Jack of Ft. Worth, and Otis of Sea Graves and Collier and O. B. of Scottsdale Arizona.

Mr. Hearne was laid to rest last Sunday afternoon with Masonic ceremonies in the presence of a large gathering of relatives and friends. His children were all present except Rodney and Mrs. Kennedy. An unusual thing and worthy of mention is the fact that his sons are all Masons and that the six present acted as pall-bearers.


