COTTON REPORT ISSUED BY SANTA FE

Following is the report prepared from reports received August 28, from Texas and Louisiana relative to crop conditions: The cotton crop in southern Texas is maturing rapidly, with picking well under way. Hot weather is causing some bolls to open prematurely, decreasing the value of the staple to some extent. In central Texas as well as territory in the west insects have appeared in a number of places. The crop is maturing under favorable conditions, and promise is held out for a fairly good yield. In northern and eastern Texas and in southwestern Louisiana there is some deterioration due to insect damage, and also from root rot, and shedding of blooms. On the whole, present indications warrant the government estimate of five million bales, or better, for Texas, as compared with 4,229,000 bales last season. A shortage of pickers is being experienced in south Texas, owing to the rapid maturing of the crop. The wheat harvest in Texas was finished several weeks ago, the unofficial returns indicating a yield of 22,500,000 bushels, as against the five-year average of 19,783,000 bushels. Corn and the other matured crops in Texas and Louisiana have made normal productions. The feed crop promises to be the heaviest in years. The movement among the farmers for a better diversification of crops and more livestock is responsible for a fifty per cent increase in the feed crop acreage. CONTROL OF BOLL WORM NOT PRACTICAL

College Station, Texas.—It is not practical for farmers to attempt to control the cotton boll worm which is causing unusual damage this season in North and East Texas, according to R. R. Reppert, Entomologist of the Texas A. & M. College Extension Service. "Earlier experimental work indicated that a considerable degree of control could be effected by keeping the foliage covered with arsenical poisons applied at frequent intervals, but experience and observation of the last few years show that even a small degree of control can be reasonably expected from such measures," he says. "Certainly the results would not reply the expense involved and the farmer might rely upon such natural control factors as the weather and other insect parasites which sometimes destroy heavy infestations of the boll worm in a short time. "The finding of an occasional pinkish cotton boll worm has led some to think they have discovered the pink boll worm," Mr. Reppert reports. "The latter insect does not grow to a length of more than one half inch, while the cotton boll worm when mature measures about one and one-fourth inches long. It is of a varied coloration from very dark green through lighter shades to almost white. Unlike the pink boll worm, the larger boll worm which is the same species that attacks corn (often called the corn ear worm) has noticeable hairs. The damage done by the cotton worms is to the bolls, the worm boring into the bolls and often hollowing them out completely. During its later stages of growth the insect is unaffected by any small amounts of poison it may eat in boring its way inside. Experience has shown that poisoning for this worm in its younger stages is not uniformly successful and hence the admonition to save time and money by leaving the control to natural factors. It is impossible to foretell just how these factors may operate in any given locality. No extensive damage from leaf worm has been so far reported to Mr. Reppert and no authentic reports of its presence in North and West Texas have been received. He believes that no extensive fight will have to be waged against them this year, but should they appear he states that prompt spraying with calcium arsenate, lead arsenate or Paris green will effectively control them.

CHEESE EXPERT SECURED FOR THE FACTORY HERE

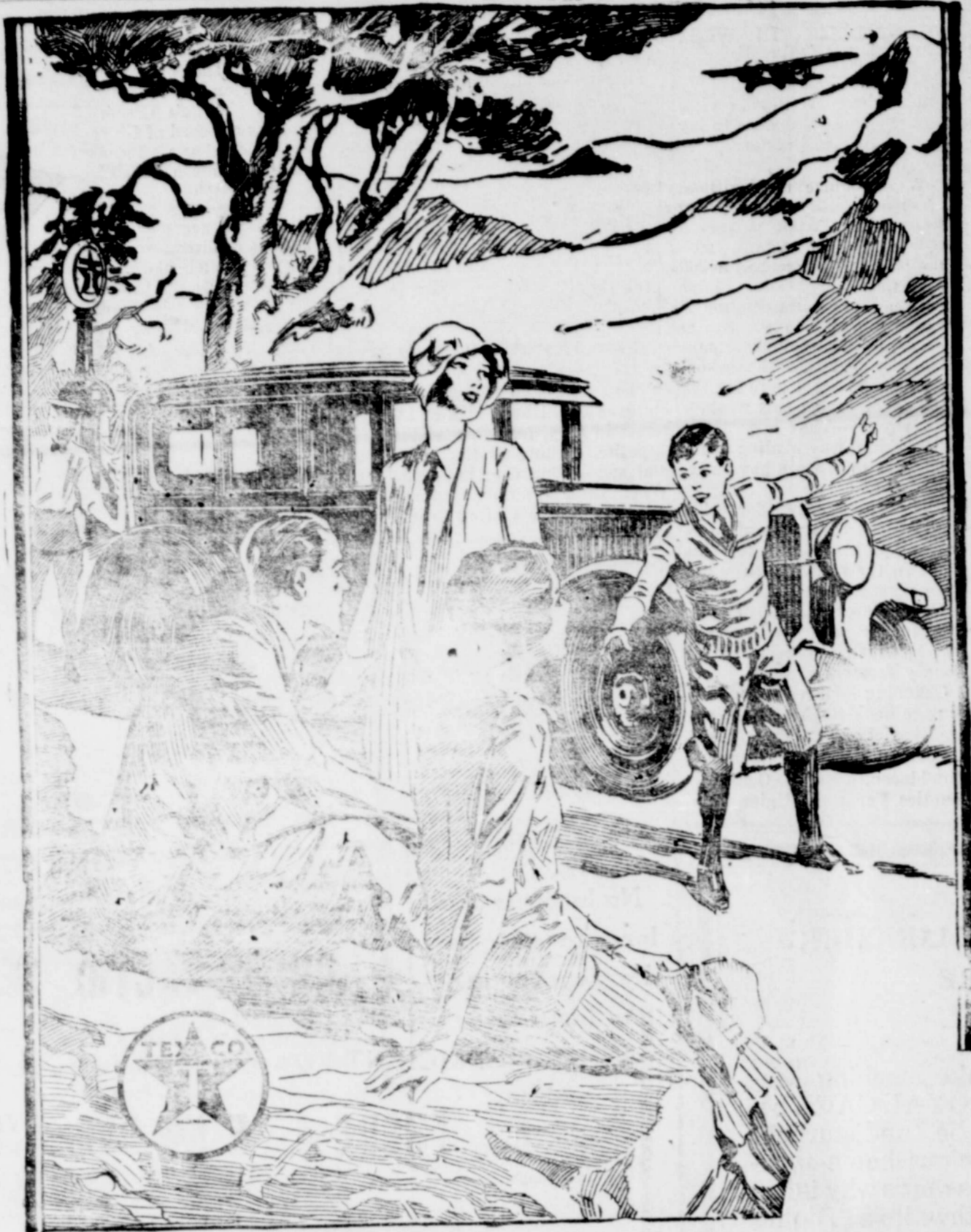

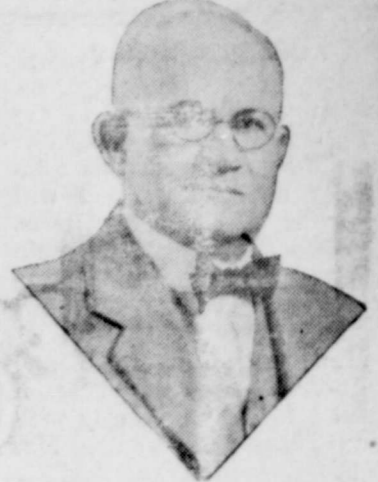

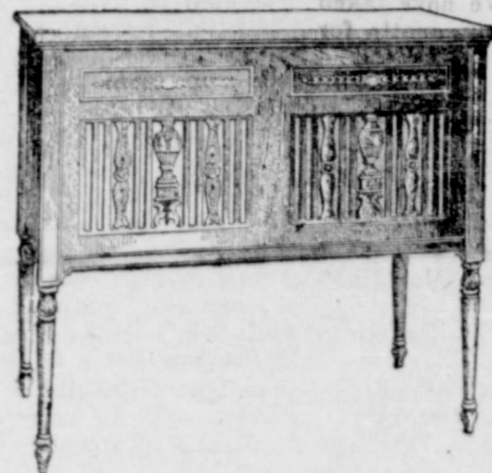
