In the Goldthwaite Post Office, duty personnel will be reduced on Saturday afternoonsmeaning that only one postal Saturdays. There is a possibilat 5:30 p. m., instead of at six o'clock, but a final decision has not yet been reached, Mrs.

The extent of the economy moves by the Department of the Post Office in Washington was indicated when Mrs. Fairman received 36 specific instructions. The problem faced by the Post Office Department putting economy measures into effect is shown by the fact that 96 per cent of its expenditures are fixed, for such items as salaries and transportation costs, thereby leaving only four per cent elbow room.





On two occasions in the past the House has overwhelmingly favored bills confirming title to the tidelands in the respective states. The first bill passed by the House was adopted by the Senate, too, but was vetoed by President Truman. We didn't have enough votes to override. Then two years ago the House repeated, but the bill did not get to a vote in the Senate. Now, for the third time, it looks like the House will get another whack at it.

Actually, this effort is but a gesture and expression because there are none who believe the President would sign a bill if we passed one and very few think there would be anything like enough votes to overfide a veto. In fact, the State's righters on tidelands had more friends in the 80th Congress than in this one. Only 29 voted against the tidelands bill then but there will be considerably year by the 81st Congress.

Only a year before, Texas had been so anxious to become a part of the Union that it offered all the school land and agreed to convey to the United States all its where he expects to reside in unsold lands if the United States would take us in and assume the \$10 million debt of the Republic, the Texas State Teachers Association has pointed out.

A treaty to that effect was flimsey claim to our tidelands today. Then, the following year the U. S. Congress passed a resolution offering Texas annexation if it would pay its own debts and keep its lands. That was an offer, and the Texas Congress accepted. Texas proceeded to adopt a new constitution which provided that titles to all lands should remain the same after annexation as they existed under the Republic. This constitution was approved





Feather-bedding scheme of Firemen's Union to put an additional fireman on diesel locomotives has been

Fact Finding Boards appointed by Presidents Roosevelt and Truman have said these demands were "devoid of merit" and they were

Now the Firemen's leaders seek to paralyze railroad transportation to compel the railroads to employ a wholly unnecessary additional fireman to ride on diesel locomotives. This scheme is plain

LEADERS OF the Firemen's union have called a nationwide strike starting with four great railroads on April 26. These railroads are the New York Central, Pennsylvania, Santa Fe, and Southern.

The union claim that a second fireman is needed on grounds of safety is sheer hypocrisy. Safety has been dragged into this dispute only in an unsuccessful effort to give a cloak of respectability to vicious feather-bedding demands.

After a careful study of the first demands of this union, a Presidential Fact Finding Board on May 21, 1943, reported to President Roosevelt that there was no need for an extra fireman on diesel locomotives.

Again, on September 19, 1949, after a second hearing on the union leaders' demands, a second Board reported to President Truman that: "there presently exists no need for an additional fireman . . . upon either the ground of safety or that of efficiency and economy of operation."

Safety Record of Diesels is **Outstandingly Good**

Although the railroads accepted the Board findings, the union leaders have brazenly rejected them. They represent that an

extra fireman is needed for "safety" reasons. Here's what the Board had to say on that point:

"The safety and on-time performance of diesel electric locomotives operated under current rules have been notably

"Upon careful analysis of the data submitted on safety, we have concluded that no valid reasons have been shown as a support for the Brotherhood proposal under which a fireman would be required to be at all times continuously in the cab of road diesels. The proposal must be rejected."

The real reason behind these demands is that the union leaders are trying to make jobs where there is no work. In other words, a plain case of "feather-bedding."

The railroads have no intention of yielding to these wasteful make-work demands. "The Safety Record of Diesels is Outstandingly Good . . . "

PRESIDENTIAL FACT FINDING BOARD REPORT Read these excerpts from official reports of Presidential Fact Finding Boards:

"The safety record of Diesels is outstandingly good, and it follows that the safety rules now applicable have produced good results.'

"The safety and on-time performance of Diesel-electric locomotives operated under current rules indicate that Diesel-electric operation has been safer than steam locomotive operation . . .

Remember! These are not statements of the railroads. They are just a few of the many similar conclusions reached by President Truman's Fact Finding Board which spent months investigating the claims of the union leaders.







TELEPHONE SERVICE IN GOLDTHWAITE If ever there was a reminder that money is only money-a medium of exchange-and that real wealth is not money, but goods and services, then we have had it in the action of the Southwestern States Telephone Company in increasing rates for Goldthwaite telephone subscribers. The Company explains that its operating costs exceed revenues. In other words, it pays out more than it takes in. With so much red ink being splashed around, there can be neither improvement nor expansion of service. The telephone service here might well be better. Sometimes it is so limping that it drives its subscribers daffy. But the Company says it can do nothing in the direction of better service so long as its output is greater than its take. Anybody in business can understand and sympathize with the problem of the Southwestern States Telephone Company. It must have enough money to live on. Earnings and operating costs must come from the customers. Capital for expansion must come from private investors, and investors are not so dumb as to put their dough into a losing proposition. The root of the trouble, in the first place, is the attitude of so many people in so many places that money is wealth. This country has been hurt badly because of the attitude, especially by unions, that there must be constant pressure for more money for less work. Operating and production and equipment costs have been sent sky-high by those with the "gimmes." Labor costs in every department are at the bottom of the action of the Southwestern States Telephone Company in asking more money from subscribers right here in Goldthwaite. The consumers here will have to pay, in all probability, for the monopolism of labor unions and for those in high places who played politics with them.
