Santa Fe Tells "Progress That Pays Its Own Way" Story In Ad Campaign

Galveston, Texas (Spec.) — "America's New Railroad — Progress that pays its own way," will be the theme of one of the largest and most powerful advertising campaigns in Santa Fe's history, F. G. Gurley, president of the railroad informed executives here today.

Starting last month, large ads ranging from approximately 600 to 2,000 lines were scheduled in 250 daily papers and 604 weekly papers. This schedule will include every daily and weekly newspaper published along the Santa Fe Railroad and daily newspapers in the major cities in the eastern section of the country, where Santa Fe traffic offices are located. The plans at present call for one ad per month in each paper for the balance of 1953.

point out that although these constant improvements cost the Santa Fe millions of dollars, they are being paid for by Santa Fe and not one dime comes out of the pocketbook of the taxpayer; Santa Fe receives no subsidy of any kind." This thought will be emphasized with the phrase "Progress that pays its own way" prominently displayed in every one of the ads.

The newspaper advertising schedule, along with the other media being used, has been planned so that the ads will reach practically every person in the United States who can read. Gurley expressed the belief that the ads are going to give people a better understanding of Santa Fe and will make them want to ship on it, ride on it, do business with it, work for it, and invest in it.

He further expressed the hope that this progressive self-financing point of view will be helpful not only to Santa Fe but to the entire railroad industry and to the business world at large.

Backing up this powerful newspaper campaign will be ads in a selected list of magazines with mass circulation. Outdoor, television and radio programs now used by the Santa Fe will also be tied into this advertising campaign.

According to Gurley, "every one of our ads in 1953 will talk about 'Santa Fe — America's New Railroad,' and will consist of a series of public information messages that will tell people about what Santa Fe is doing every year, every month, every week and every day to keep itself new."

Lone Star Gas Application For Rate Increase Approved By RR Commission

The Railroad Commission of Texas has approved Lone Star Gas Company's application to increase residential and commercial rates for natural gas service outside the corporate limits of Goldthwaite and in unincorporated towns and communities in the vicinity, according to an announcement by M. L. Bird of Dallas, operating manager for Lone Star's general division of distribution.

The Railroad Commission order authorizing the rate adjustment calls for an increase of 13 cents per thousand cubic feet of gas, Mr. Bird said. He pointed out that Lone Star has been granted similar rate adjustments by city councils in Goldthwaite and in more than 140 other incorporated cities and towns in Texas since last September.

Mr. Bird stated that residential and commercial rates charged by Lone Star had not been increased generally within the last twenty-five years, but, conversely, were reduced ten

cents per thousand cubic feet in May, 1942. He said the new rate for the unincorporated areas is only three cents per thousand cubic feet higher than the rate charged by Lone Star prior to the 1942 reduction.

The Lone Star operating manager expressed appreciation to the Railroad Commission for "consideration of the gas company application," pointing out that the "new rate makes it possible for us to continue to maintain our high standard of service on the plane desired and expected by our customers."

The Railroad Commission has original jurisdiction of natural gas rates in unincorporated towns and areas in Texas.

Lewis W. Conner Takes Part In "Invasion" Operation

Sixth Fleet (FHTNC) (Spec.)

The attack transport USS Cambria was in one of the largest combined naval operations ever conducted by the North Atlantic Treaty Organization in Mediterranean waters from March 17th to 25th.

Serving aboard is Lewis W. Conner, radioman first class, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Walter L. Conner of Route 1, Goldthwaite, Texas.

The Cambria was operating with naval and land forces of England, France, Italy, Greece and Turkey in "Operation Rendezvous," an eight-day operation ranging from North Africa to the Southern Coast of France, from the coast of Italy to the island of Crete.

The large scale combined operation, involving virtually every phase of offensive and defensive tactics, was a sea and amphibious exercise which also featured land-based air, submarine, motor-torpedo boat, carrier, cruiser, destroyer, escort and auxiliary units.

The operation culminated an amphibious "invasion" of Crete.

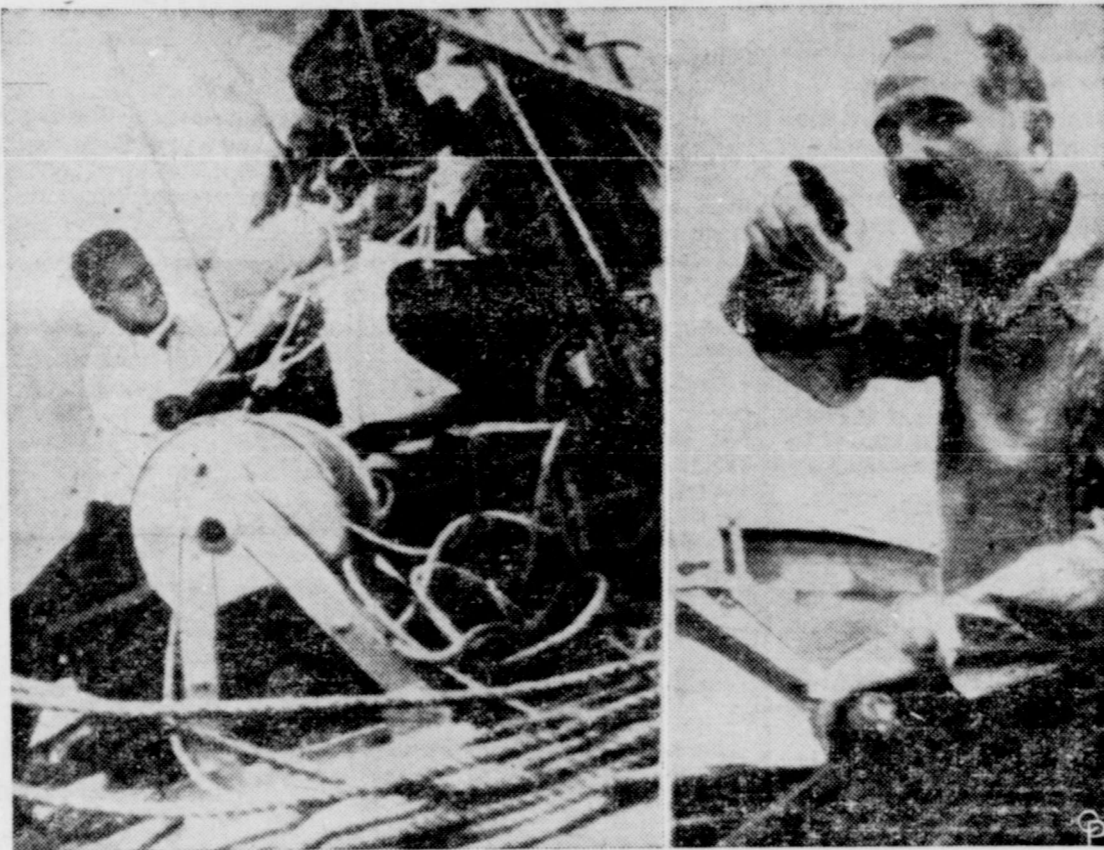

Portuguese Stuffed Cabbage

By ALICE DENHOFF
BIG special today is Stuffed Cabbage Leaves, Portuguese Style. To serve 6, mix one pound chopped or ground raw beef, tbsp steak sauce, 1 1/2 c. uncooked rice together with 2 tbsp. salt and 1/4 tsp. pepper. Chop fine 2 medium-sized tomatoes and add to meat and rice mixture.

Handle Leaves Carefully
Cut off the outer leaves from a large, firm head of cabbage, removing carefully so as not to tear them. Use 12 to 14 leaves. Pour boiling water over leaves to wilt them so they do not tear during the filling and folding. If the center stalks of the leaves are large, pare them.

Divide the rice-meat mixture into as many portions as there are leaves to stuff. Place a portion of the mixture in the center of each leaf. Wrap tightly, tucking in the ends securely. Place in a greased baking dish with the smooth part on the top and the tucked-in part at the bottom. Pack the rolls tightly in the baking dish, and add boiling water to nearly cover them. Squeeze juice of 1 1/2 lemons over the top of the cabbage leaf rolls. Bake, covered, at 325° F. for 1 1/2 hours.

If desired, these rolls may be cooked in a tomato sauce. If this is done, omit the lemon juice and use 2 c. of tomato juice in place of part of the water used to cover the rolls.

Now to move into the dessert department for a rich, calories-be-hanged sweet.

To prepare the crust, roll fine package of Holland rusk; mix thoroughly with 1/2 c. softened butter, 1/4 c. sugar and tsp. cinnamon. Reserving small amount of mixture for topping, press remaining amount in an even layer against side and bottom of 8 1/2-inch pie plate. Fill with cream filling.

To prepare filling, heat 2 c. milk in top of double boiler. Blend 2 tbsp. cornstarch, 1/4 c. sugar and 1/4 tsp. salt thoroughly; stir into milk. Cook over boiling water until thickened, about 15 minutes, stirring occasionally. Stir a little cornstarch mixture slowly into 2 egg yolks, return to double boiler, and cook 5 minutes longer.

Beat 2 egg whites stiff but not dry; add 1/4 c. sugar gradually. Spread meringue on top of filling; sprinkle with reserved rusk crumbs. Bake at 325° F. for 20 minutes. Serve warm or chilled.


