





#### Census Bureau To Ask Questions On Commuting Habits

Questions designed to throw light on commuting habits of Americans will be asked in the September Current Population, Survey, according to Supervisor Charles E. Fay of the Census Bureau's district office at Dallas, Texas.

Persons in the Current Population Survey reporting panel will be asked if the county in which they work is different from the county in which they reside. The main purpose of this inquiry is to determine how many workers commute to their jobs.

The questions on commuting are in addition to the usual inquiries on employment and unemployment asked each month in the Current Population Survey.

The Current Population Survey will be taken locally and in 229 other sections of the country during the week of September 12. Local interviews will be conducted by Nella P. Casbeer of Lampasas, Texas.



#### BARBED WIRE FENCE

In 1876, John W. Gates, a young drummer, sold barbed wire to the ranchers of Texas. In San Antonio the cattlemen laughed at him. In response to their jibes, Gates fenced in a city plaza and called for the "worst fence busters" of the herds. The cattle charged the wire as was expected but their hides were pierced by the barbs. They soon retired. Barbed wire came into use throughout the range area by 1883. Strife arose between cattlemen and fence-cutting became general. In some counties feeling ran so high that there was threat of civil warfare. An act of Legislature, together with the Texas Rangers, ended the strife.

NEED FOR COVER CROP

If experience is the best teacher, then Texas has had some harsh and bitter instructions on the need to save our agricultural land.

Drouth has exhausted most of the subsoil moisture from vast sections of the state. Hot sweeping over nude fields lifted great quantities of our top soil and powdered it into worthless dust. The disaster set us back many years in farm progress.

This is the second time in 20 years that we have experienced a "dust bowl" era. Apparently, we didn't learn our lessons very well the first time. But there are exceptions.

During a recent survey of the Plains area, a curious and heartening phenomena was observed. Next to a completely blown out field you could see a plot which still retained its topsoil. The relatively undamaged areas were those where the remaining soil moisture was utilized to produce cover crops.

Thousands of acres of land are allowed to lie barren in the off seasons in Texas. These fields are the first to suffer damage when dry winds start to blow. Yet, time after time, cover crops have proven to be an important factor in preventing this waste. We should take advantage of this know-

Government authorities recognize this fact. As a result, a recent change in the Agricultural Conservation Program makes any farmer or rancher eligible to apply for cost-sharing of planting cover or green manure crops on cropland which will be shifted from crop production next year. The ACP authorizes payment of up to 50 percent of the cost of seedbed preparation, fertilizer, lime and seed for establishing cover crop on such land.

The main purpose of this aid is to provide adequate protective cover. But such crops can also provide emergency winter pasture for livestock. In many cases, this will be the only home-grown roughage available this winter and therefor ceould be extremely important in Tex-

Farmers and ranchers are encouraged to take advantage of the program this year. Conservation practices are drastically needed in all sections of the drouth area. A lot of poor crop land should be retired to grasses and much more needs to be protected during the and early spring winter

In view of an expected shortage of some forage seeds due to short crops this year, farmers are advised to anticipate their needs and order seed


