

Latin America's Voice In United Nations Vital U. S. Working to Keep Neighbors on Our Side

Special to Central Press Association

WASHINGTON—The administration, worried over the neutransu tendency of the Asian-African bloc of nations, is redoubling its efforts to keep the Latin American countries firmly on the side of the West. The 20 Latin American nations form almost the deciding bloc at the United Nations, and their votes are vital if the policy of the West is to continue to prevail.

The Latin American nations, for example, failed to vote as a unit on the Algerian question, which provoked France to withdraw from some of the UN organs. If the Latin American bloc had voted together on the question, France would have won.

Cultivation in the United States of the Latin American countries is demonstrated by the toplevel briefings Latin envoys are getting on the United States' global policy.

Before departing for Geneva and the Foreign Ministers' Conference, Secretary of State John Foster Dulles called the Latin diplomats in to inform them of the United States' position at the conference. When Dulles returns, he will brief them on results of the meeting.

9 JOHNSON ON THE MEND-Senate Majority Leader Lyndon B. Johnson (D), Texas, has been given the green light by his medical advisers to reassume his leadership post when Congress convenes in January.

Johnson, stricken with a serious heart attack last summer, has recovered remarkably, and, pending a final check-up, is in shape to take control of Senate Democratic strategy again.

The senator's return to duty is expected to help keep opposing party factions in line during the coming session and enable the Democrats to enact legislation that will benefit them in 1956.

The action of the Democrat-controlled Congress in the final session may well spell out the party's platform at next year's national con-

Social Security

provision became a part of the Social Security Act, it offered, in many instances, substantially increased benefit amounts to disabled persons meeting the requirements. Until the freeze provision became operative, a worker who had no earnings for a prolonged period because of disability might find his social security benefits cut down considerably or lost completely by the time he reached 65 and was otherwise eligible to collect

Under the new "disability freeze" provision in the law, a worker who has been totally disabled for 6 months or more with a disability which is expected to continue indefinitely, can apply to have his social security record frozen as of the time his disability began. 




