## **Questions And Answers About** Social Security

Question: My employer, for whom I baby-sit two or three times a week, states that she has not collected any social security taxes from me because she does not know the procedure for collecting, reporting and

she obtain this information? Answer: Your employer may write to her District Director of Internal Revenue, asking for number, report forms, and instructions. Or she may ask the nearest Social Security Office for a phamplet entitled "Do You Have A Maid?" This phamplet contains a printed request to the Internal Revenue Service for the necessary material.

Question: I married last year and did not have my name changed on my social security card until recently. My employer used my married name even though the card showed my maiden name. Will I get credit for the wages that were reported incorrectly?

Answer: Your employer probably received a request from the Social Security Administration for your correct name so that your wages could be should request a statement of our earnings, using a postcard form available for this purpose. If the statement is not correct, your Social Security Office can assist you in getting your earnings credited.
