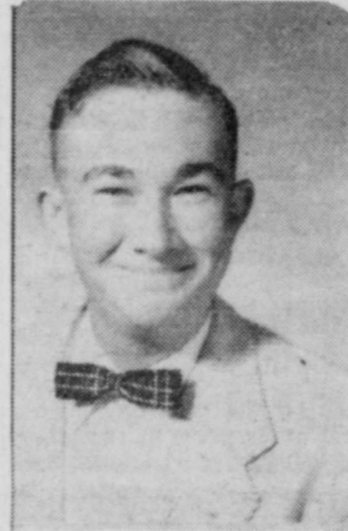

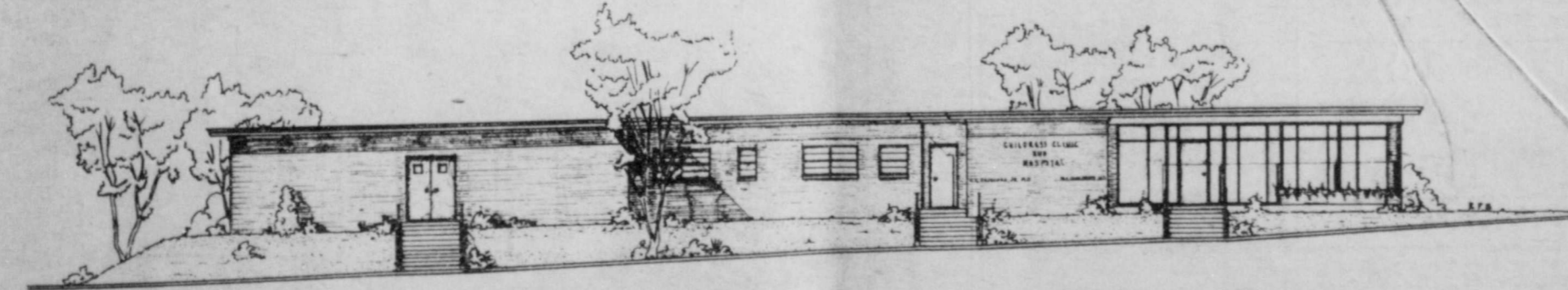
All boys signing up for Little League are asked to bring their parents to this meeting if possible.

## NEW WING FOR HOSPITAL

Plans are being completed for an expansion program at Childress Clinic and Hospital that will provide a new wing that will accommodate sixteen additional patients, it was announced this week by Dr. M. A. Childress. The new addition will cost approximately \$55,000.

The addition is shown in the artist's drawing above extending from the shaded area to the left. It will be approximately 42 ft. by 100 ft., with floor space of 4200 square feet.

The new wing will join the

south end of present building and will be facing east with the front being on the same property line as the front of the clinic part of the building. Separate entrance will be provided as shown in this photo, but it will be used for emergencies only. The main entrance to the hospital will continue to be in the center of the building.

There will be eight rooms in the new addition with four baths. Also special storage room for supplies and air conditioning and heating equipment. Also a day room which can be converted into patient

room when needed. In addition to the new wing some other changes will be made such as re-locating the nurses' station for more efficient operation, and new nursery.

Dr. Childress said this week that plans and specifications are in the final stages and they should be ready to submit to contractors in the next two weeks.

### SURGERY

The hospital has been in the process of adding equipment for the surgery the past few weeks since Dr. Childress announced

the association of Dr. C. G. Cruzcosa, Jr., with the staff. Most of the equipment has been installed and the first surgery was done in the hospital Monday of this week. Major surgery was done on Wednesday.

The hospital has been operating at capacity most of the time since it was opened a year ago. There has been a definite need for additional rooms for some time.

### FINANCING

Dr. Childress announced that \$40,000 has been pledged towards the project by Mills

County State Bank and a group of interested citizens in the county. This leaves \$15,000 still available to interested parties who may like to invest some funds at six per cent interest.

Funds may be invested in the project in multiples of \$500, according to announcement by Childress.

Those who have pledged may deposit their funds with Mills County State Bank since plans are being pushed for completion of financing. Childress and the committee working with him on the project hope to have the full amount subscribed by June 1.

The power mower has taken its place and is found as part of the necessary equipment at most homes. And a mighty handy and useful tool it is too. In fact a lot of us are wondering how we got along before the power mower, such as it is today, came along.

Back to the word of caution. And a case history to make the point.

Louis Oliver was mowing his lawn the other day and the mower picked up a small piece of old rusty wire, little more than an inch long, and hurled it out from under the shield and it went through his leather boot and was imbedded in his ankle. This is one of those unavoidable accidents that happen.

Power mowers travel at a terrific speed and will throw wire, rocks, pieces of glass or other objects that can cause serious injuries. When using power mowers folk should use caution and not let children, or adults, be in line with the grass outlet of the mower.

**PECANS**

There is a heavy set of pecans on the trees this year. The time of spraying for the Pecan Nut casebearer will be around the 23rd to the 30th of May. The control for this insect is 3 pounds of 50 per cent wettable DDT to 100 gallons of water or 3 pounds of 50 per cent wettable malathion to 100 gallons of water. If Rosette (a nutritional deficiency disease) is a problem be sure and add to the nut casebearer spray 2 pounds of Zinc sulfate.

ed with the Pecan leaf phylloxera. This insect produces galls on the leaves of the pecan tree and when the galls are split open you can see the soft-bodied insects. These insects have probably done all the damage that they are going to do this year. Each leaf that is affected will drop from the tree.

To control the phylloxera spray the trees with a dormant oil in the winter. If dormant oil was not applied the 3 pounds of 25 per cent malathion wettable powder used for pecan nut casebearer will aid in controlling this insect.
