Gene Long, son of Mrs. Lee Long, a 13 year man with the U. S. Navy, is a member of the Mobile Training Team assigned to the HMS ETHIOPIA, according to information received here by the MTT.

The MTT includes 17 men and three officers that are going on the cruise to deliver the ship to Ethiopia, training a crew for the

ship. O. Ryce, Lieutenant Commander, U. S. Navy, wrote and Mrs. Long as follows: "If you can imagine a Naval Ship being operated by 20 newly graduated and 250 just-graduated boot camp enlisted personnel, none of whom having any appreciable sea experience, you have an idea of the

The trip will take about 40 days of underway time through the Pacific and Indian oceans. A number of foreign ports will be visited including Hong Kong, Manila, Singapore and Colombo (Ceylon). They expect to arrive at their destination—the ship's homeport of Massawa, Eritrea, about June 16.

Commander Ryce stated further: "I am proud of heading up the team of which your son is an important team-member. The MTT's accomplishment to date is something of which you and every American citizen can be proud."

**CALENDAR OF FACT AND OPINION**—David Lawrence writes, in U. S. News & World Report: "Could the spiritual emotion that swept the world as Colonel Glenn was descending to the earth be extended to reach the hearts and minds of the millions of persons behind the Iron Curtain? For by their concerted will they can transform a world beset with fears of self-destruction into a brotherhood of peace. Miracles do happen when the world shows its humility in prayer. The voices that besought Almighty God to save the life of Colonel Glenn can speak again, as even more of us petition Him to save humanity from nuclear war. For those prolonged minutes of prayer on Tuesday, Feb. 20, constituted man's 'finest hour'."

According to the Association of American Railroads, the federal, state and local governments will make record expenditures this year—averaging more than \$271 for every family in the nation—to promote the railroads' competitors. The money will go for the domestic waterways, highways, airports and airways, and air mail subsidy payments. The total cost will be about \$13.8 billion, of which \$4.6 billion will be spent by the federal government, and \$9.1 billion by state and local governments. In 1960, the Association adds, the self-supporting railroads spent more than \$1.4 billion on their rights-of-way for construction, maintenance and tax payments.

From the Russell, Kansas, News: "In America, when three or more people are together they are apt to form an organization; in England, a protest committee, and in Africa, another country."

According to the March, 1962 issue of U. S. Naval Institute Proceedings, "A revolutionary, deep-diving aluminum research submarine, designed to explore the ocean depths almost three miles down, is under construction . . . with launching scheduled for 1963 . . . With only about 2 per cent of the ocean's bottom topography adequately recorded, there is a pressing need for a research submarine that will provide operational familiarity with the undersea environment at great depths. 'Aluminaut,' as the undersea vessel is called, should be able to do this, for the craft is designed to operate at a depth of 15,000 feet . . . (and) is expected to provide valuable information for combat submarines to operate at great depths."

Some 600,000 people were bitten by dogs last year. Today's Health, the American Medical Association's magazine of general circulation, provides a few simple, precautionary rules: Don't give a dog to a small child—under six—unless you are prepared to be constantly on the scene when the two are together. Never allow a child to tease or abuse the dog, and see that he learns about training and care. Let the dog alone while he is eating. Remember that a dog, stimulated by running and playing, may bite from sheer excitement. Never waken a sleeping dog abruptly. Be careful in trying to separate fighting dogs—one or both may turn on you.

Henry Hazlitt writes, in Newsweek: "It is no accident that some of our most serious unemployment is in the coal and steel industries, in which hourly wages have been \$3.10 and \$3.26 an hour respectively, compared with an average of \$2.34 in all manufacturing. And these job-destroying wage rates are the result, in turn, of the special legal powers and immunities that government has conferred on the unions."
