WIPE OUT SCREWWORMS-Another \$1.3 million is needed to reach the goal set by Southwestern livestock producers and sportsmen to eradicate the screwworm from Texas and the Southwest. These men are carrying on an intensive campaign this month to reach this goal, Mr. L. B. Burnham, chairman of the county animal health committee, has announced. The program, study and consideration. Action which has been operational since February, involves the release of sterile screwworm flies over infested areas of the Southwest by airplanes, Mr. Burnham says there is still time to contribute to this project.

FEDERAL ASSISTANCE

Three agencies of the Federal government were contacted. They included Farm and Home Administration, Housing and Home Finance Agency, and Soil Conservation Service.

Farm and Home Administration loan would be too costly for the city of Goldthwaite and its water users.

Housing and Home Finance Agency assistance is based on percentage of unemployment in a community and Goldthwaite does not qualify.

Soil Conservation Service offers a possibility but a number of factors enter into this picture that appear to make it. impractical. SCS would participate in construction of reservoir, but it would be based on flood prevention, A study would be made and it would take about three years to develop. Cost would be high, land have to be bought and long pipe line and share cost in building dam. Engineers said it is doubtful that it could be done for the same amount of money that would be required to go to the Colorado River,

COLORADO RIVER

Studies made in 1959 and the just completed indicate that the Colorado River at the Sikes location as most economical source of a permanent water

The U. S. Study Commission has recommended that the Fox Crossing reservoir be constructed between 1975 and 2010. No elevations were given in their report but maps indicate that e lake would extend above the Sikes location,

The Corps of Engineers is now studying the Colorado River but it will be 12 to 18 months before they will have any definite

COST ESTIMATES

Cost estimates have been presented in line with reductions made from those presented in 1959 including: reduction in offwaite for the first nine months channel storage with less land, reducing the size of the pipeline, and eliminating proposed improvements in distribution

Estimated cost of the project after reductions were made is placed by the engineers at

FINANCING

A more simple and easier method of financing the project was also presented.


The plans would call for voting \$200,000 in City of Goldthwaite Utility Revenue Bonds which would be retired from net operating profits from existing utility receipts over a 30 year period.

Voting \$225,000 in Water District Tax bonds that would be retired over a period of 31 years from water district tax. This tax would be assessed on the same rendition and at the same rate as the present city

Answer to the question from individual taxpayer, What Will It Cost Me?, would be: the same amount that you are paying at present for city taxes.

If a property owner is paying \$4.50 a year for city taxes he would pay an additional \$4.50 per year. If he paid \$30.00 he would pay an additional \$30.00.
