





Answer-A reservist whose training or education under the Korean GI Bill was interrupted by the call up for active service will have his deadline for completing his education or training extended by a period of time equal to the length of his "call-up" period of service.

Question-Are young people engaged in the VA's War Orphan Educational program benefitted by provisions of a new

Answer - Yes. If they are forced to suspend their schooling or training because of finreasons beyond their control, such as illness in their immediate family, or because the job at which they work requires their presence on the job at a certain season, their deadline date will be extended by the length of time they are thus kept out of training


