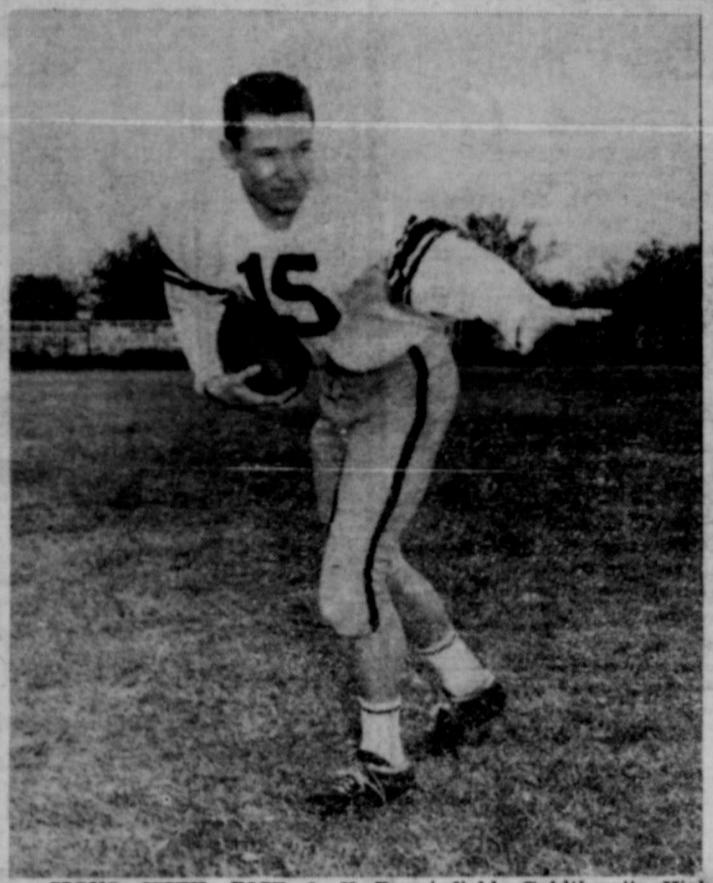
J. S. Kemp, Mullin Resident, Celebrates 100th Birthday Sunday

Wolves Causing Heavy Livestock Losses In North Part Of County

Wolves have been responsible for heavy livestock losses to ranchers in the northern part of Mills County during the past year, County Judge Cecil Egger reported this week.

County officials, have been cooperating financially with ranchers in the area to secure the services of a Government trapper to try and stamp out the wolves.

The cooperative program has been underway for the past three months, with little success, from the standpoint of catching the wolves. A number of fox and other varmints have been caught.

The Commissioners' Court contributed \$100 per month for December, January and February. This was matched by ranchers towards the salary of a government trapper to work the area.

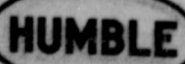

Goldthwaite Public Schools

Payroll during the year totals \$145,812 which is paid to 43 members of the faculty and employees.

Annual budget for Goldthwaite school system this year is \$200,172. This does not include lunchroom operations.

There are 25 teachers and administrators in the school system.

The school system operates six buses and two private carriers driving approximately 102,000 miles per year.

Estimated value of school buildings, land and equipment and all physical facilities of the district would run in the neighborhood of \$700,000. These include Elementary School, High School Gymnasium, Stadium, Agriculture Building, Storage Building, High School Lunchroom and approximately 80 acres of land.

Total enrollment for the 1962-63 year has now reached 494 pupils for both high school, junior high and elementary school.

Goldthwaite Schools operate two modern lunchrooms serving an average of 420 meals daily and total expected for the year of 73,500.

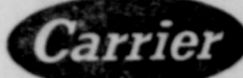

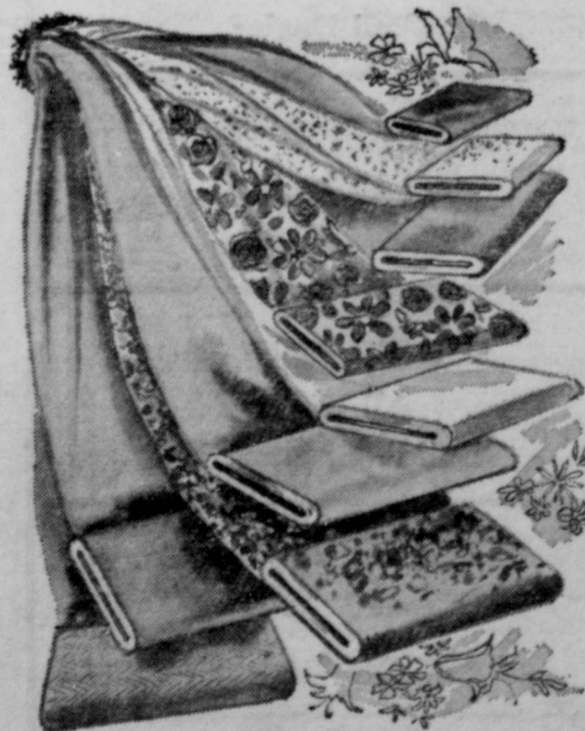

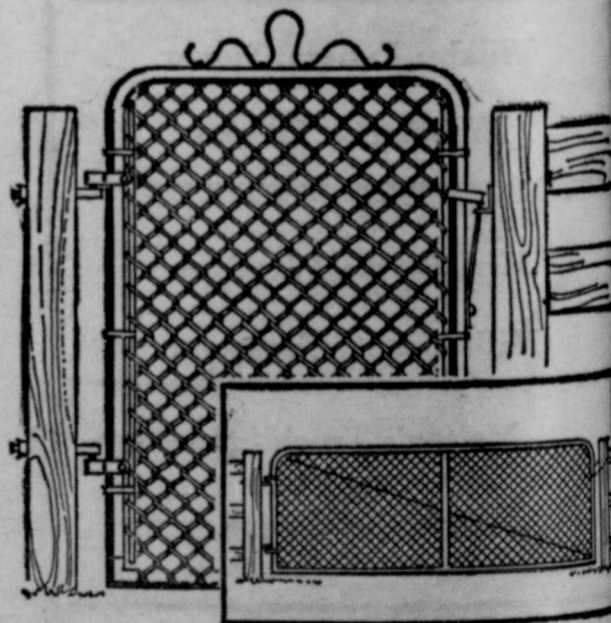
