But floods persisted in the Angelo area. When rains fell in Western Tom Green and even in Iron county, floodwaters rolled down Spring Creek and the middle Concho and poured into Narsworthy.

It became evident that another reservoir was needed.

Two years ago engineering work was completed and evidence produced to show a dam was justified at the Twin Mountain site.

The dam now has been finished at a spot only 12 miles west of the San Angelo Courthouse, and rains are awaited to fill the lake.

It was built by the Bureau of Reclamation.

All new lakes afford excellent fishing during their first few years, and no doubt this new San Angelo lake will live up to those traditions,

However, it has more to offer. Not only will it fill up with flood water, but it will be spring fed, too. Many springs along the Mertzon and Spring Creeks flow into the Conchos.

Meanwhile, development work is progressing on Lake Nasworthy. It will be a wonderful little constant level lake.

During recent monthe developers have been busy running channels from Nasworthy behind some of the lake cabins around it.

This creates a paradoxical situation because generally San Angelo is recognized as a part of that great arid portion of West Texas. Yet it will have the most modern lake in Texas with boat roads behind many of its lovely homes, just like Florida.

So the coming of the Twin Mountain dam will mean a great deal to those west Texas fishermen who have been going a long way for their outdoor recreation,


