City Council And Water Board Will Sell Bonds On Open Bids

Members of the Goldthwaite City Council and the board of supervisors of Mills County Fresh Water Supply District No. One, will sell the water improvement program bonds on the open bond market to the best bidder, it was announced by the two groups meeting in special session last Wednesday night.

The two official groups met at the city hall in joint session when they heard reports on the work program undertaken to date and made plans for financing.

Meeting with the council and water board were Bob King, from Joe J. Rady & Associates, Engineers, and Henry Keller, representing The First of Texas Corporation, bonding firm.

The City Council and the Water Board voted to enter into contract agreement for the First of Texas Corporation to represent the city and the water district as fiscal agent on a fee basis.

NEWS HELD OVER

The Eagle staff has been behind for time and space since the Labor Day holiday last week, which resulted in a number of news stories and community letters not getting into the paper this week. Every effort will be made to catch up with all news reports in the next issue.—The Editor.

Under the agreement the fiscal agent will prepare brochure for sale of the bonds to bidders, and take care of all other legal and fiscal details and expenses involved from the beginning of the project that dates back to 1959 when work was first begun on planning for the water program and up to and including delivery of the bonds to purchaser.

1964 Wheat Program

One part of the law governing the current wheat program is apparently not clear to many of this area's wheat producers, according to ASCS officials.

This is caused by provisions of the law which apply to years when marketing quotas are not in effect, such as will be the case for the 1964 crop. This part of the law says that the allotment for the farm in future years will be cut back if the allotment is overplanted, as might be possible in 1964.

This has been in the law since 1958.

Mills County ASCS officials explained that if quotas were in effect, then a farmer exceeding his wheat acreage allotment could store the excess, or deliver it to the Secretary of Agriculture. When this is done, the wheat acreage history for that year is not affected. But when quotas are NOT in effect, no farm marketing excess can be determined for any farm, and the farm would be credited with only the farm wheat allotment as history for future allotments.

A farmer overplanting his allotment in 1964 would affect the 1966 and future wheat allotments.

It would not affect his 1965 allotment.

Overplanting his 1964 allotment would reduce his future allotments, beginning in 1966, by about 6 to 8 per cent.

Mills County Is Recommended For Drought Benefits

The Mills County Disaster Committee, composed of E. L. Burkett, George Reese and Marlis Barker, have been advised that the Texas State Disaster Committee has recommended that Mills County be approved for the Livestock Feed Program under the provisions of Public Law 86-299 and Public Law 87-127. Also, the State Disaster Committee has recommended that Mills County be approved for seasonal grazing and haying on Conservation Reserve, Feed Grain and Wheat Stabilization diverted acres.

These requests which were submitted by Mills County, together with the State Disaster Committee recommendations, have been forwarded to the Washington Office for their consideration.

As of to date Mills County has not been approved. Until such time that the county is approved grazing of diverted or Conservation Reserve acreage will constitute a violation. Therefore, the Disaster Committee urges each producer who has acreage under one of these programs to secure approval from the ASC County Committee prior to grazing such acreage.

Goldthwaite P-TA Schedules First Meeting Of Year

The Goldthwaite P-T. A. will have the first meeting of the new school year Monday night, September 16th, at 7:30 o'clock in the High School Auditorium.

The theme for P-TA this year is, "We, The P-TA, Seek to Understand the Family Story." To present this month's program a "Back To School Night" assembly will be held in the auditorium where parents and teachers will be in three groups.

Elementary discussion will be under the direction of Ray Standley and Mrs. Lois Skipp, with Mr. Standley explaining the new reading method used in elementary grades.

Junior High group will be under the direction of H. L. Browning. Supt. LeRoy Beard will meet with high school group, and the new math books, method of teaching, and change over in the math classes will be explained to parents. Question and answer period will follow the discussion.

Rodney House will present the devotional. Mrs. Ozella Jones will keep the children in her home, two blocks South of high school.

Prevent Fall Increase Of Screwworm Cases

An increase in the screwworm population this fall must be prevented if early eradication of this livestock pest is to be realized, officials of the Southwest Screwworm Eradication Program emphasize.

Favorable weather conditions and shearing and other ranch operations usually result in a marked increase in screwworm infestations in both livestock and wildlife from early September through November.

Eradication machinery is poised to move quickly onto farms and ranches where screwworms are reported. Officials stress livestockmen should watch closely for infested animal wounds; they should save samples of the larvae and immediately send sample to Mission, Texas. Mailing tubes may be obtained from Steen Hardware, L. B. Burnham or County Agent George Reese.

The 19-month-old program has already reduced the annual incidence of screwworm infestations by more than 95 per cent. As fall operations approach, screwworm cases are at an all-time low for the season. For example, less than 75 cases were reported during August as compared to over 5,000 for the same month last year. Mills County had not had a reported case of screwworms in 1963. Only two of those cases were reported in the area of South Texas where screwworms can survive during the winter. This area must be kept free if eradication is to be achieved, officials said.

Acreage Survey To Start Today

Postmaster Lucile Fairman announced today that Rural Mail Carriers will begin distributing 1963 Acreage Survey Cards to patrons on their routes about September 12.

The Post Office Department assists U. S. D. A. in making this survey each year. These reports, directly from farmers, are the basis for official estimates for Texas acreage of all crops harvested in 1963.

To be sure this community is well represented in the survey, Postmaster Fairman urges each patron receiving a card to fill it out and return it to his mail box.

Rural mail carriers working on this project are: Sebern E. Thornton, Route One; Julian D. Evans, Route Two; and Delmar W. Sears, Route Three.

Eagles Defeat San Saba 26-20; To Play Dublin This Friday Night

It's football time again and the Goldthwaite Eagles got off to a good start Friday night by defeating the San Saba Armadillos for the first time in a number of years. The final score was 26 to 20.

With the score tied 0-0 in the first quarter the Eagles began a 44-yard drive which ended when halfback Cecil Campbell plunged over from the one-yard line for the TD. Quarterback Gene Gray tossed to Campbell

for the extra points and Goldthwaite led 8-0 with 8:49 remaining in the second quarter.

The second Eagle TD came after recovering a Dillo fumble on the San Saba nine. The Black and Gold took the opportunity and quickly pushed forward, sending Gray over for another 6 points. The try for extra points was unsuccessful. At the end of the half the Eagles led 14-0, having made seven first downs to San Saba's one.

The picture changed in the third quarter, however, when Keith Sanderson dashed 50 yards to the Goldthwaite 12-yard line. Fullback Jerry Eden tallied up the Dillos' first 6 and Sanderson added another 2 points. The score stood at 14-8.

But within minutes, the Eagles were again in scoring position, and a quick pass from Gray to Campbell made the scoreboard flicker. The PAT failed, but the Eagles had moved back to a 12 point lead.

The Dillos moved again before the end of the quarter, but the extra points failed.

The Eagles held a slim 6-point lead at the start of the last quarter but a beautiful 27 yard run by Gray put the Black and Gold two jumps ahead: 26-14. The clock showed 0:28 seconds left in the game, but this was time enough for San Saba's quarterback Jarvis Shaw to close the gap to six points; the clock finally ran out leaving Goldthwaite on top 26-20.

Equipment added include a new puff set machine for sleeve and shoulder work on garments in the finishing department and a new spotting board for the cleaning department.

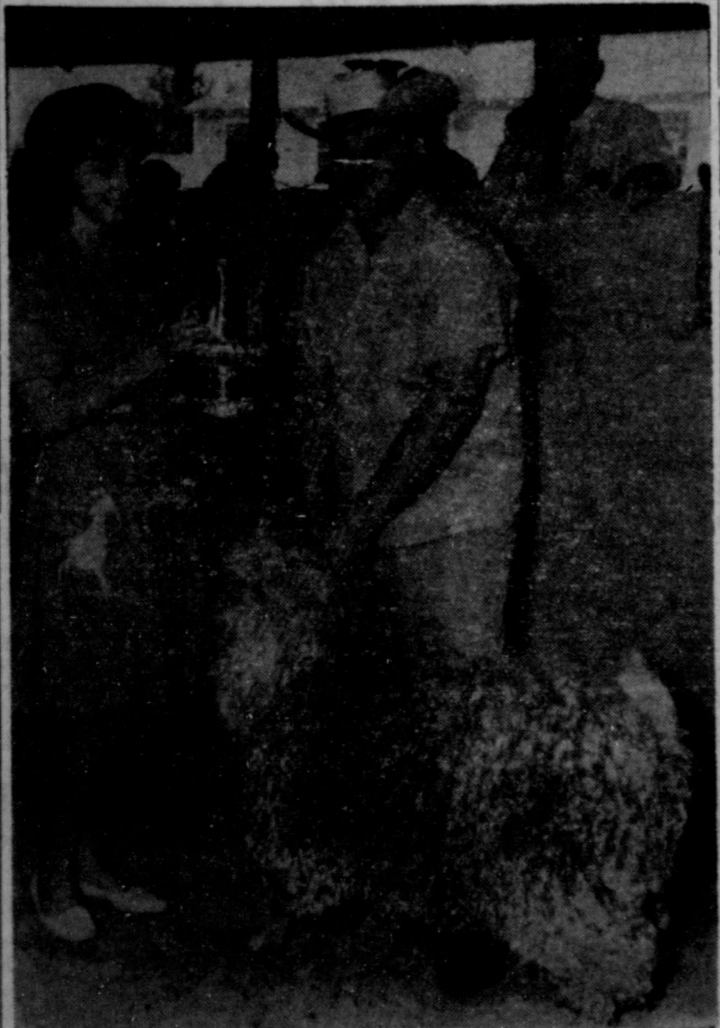
Lions Club Broom Sale Today

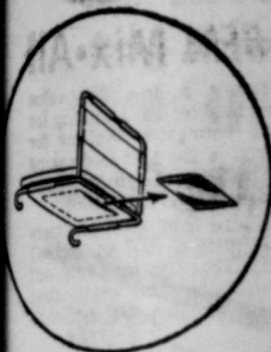

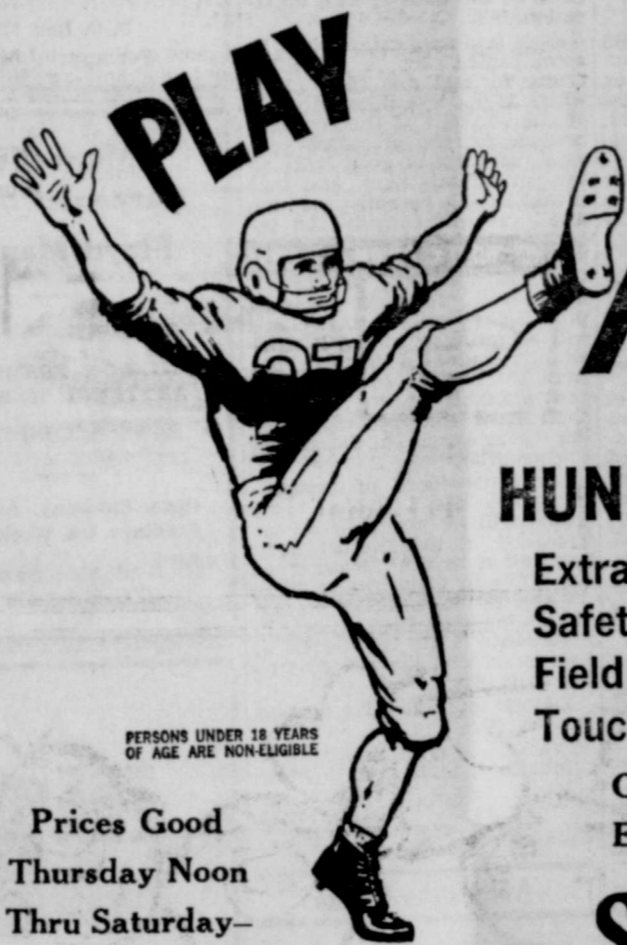
