The \$65,947.00 headquarters building is located at the intersection of U.S. Highway 84 and Reilly Street, four blocks east of the courthouse square. Construction of the building got underway in July and is scheduled for completion in November, according to Raymond Summy, general manager. new Texas and United The building is located on a 120 by 150 foot lot facing west with entrance on Reilly Street.
