

Fishing With Hellgrammites

When baiting your line with hellgrammites, let the bait sink to the bottom so it can drift or crawl away in a nat-

hunter who has little occasion to stick his hands in water. Gloves should be loose fitting so the one on your trigger hand can be slipped off in a hurry.

Leather gloves are no good for duck hunting or fishing. They get wet easily and soak up a lot of water. Then when you dry them out, they'll shrink and get stiff.

For working around water get cotton gloves that have been rubberized. Again they should be large enough so you can slip the on and off easily.

If possible, skip shaving the day before you make that cold weather hunting or fishing trip. That stubble on your face offers some protection against cold and it will help prevent face chapping.

As an extra precaution, take along a change of clothes and leave them in your car. You never know when you'll get caught in a rain squall or perhaps take an unexpected dunk-
