The Cookie Sale starts today and will close Saturday, February 29. The 1964 Council goal is to sell a total of 50,000 packages of cookies. The quota for Goldthwaite is 960 packages.

This is a project by and for the Girl Scouts and it affords every Girl Scout an opportunity to assume responsibility while practicing sound business methods. Lt. Col. Richard L. West of Fort Hood presented the program which covered "Operation Big Lift" conducted by the 2nd Armored Division last Fall. He was assisted by John R. Lane of Killeen, Deputy District Governor of Lions District 2X-3 Texas.

John Burrus, cowboy entertainer from Indian Gap, presented several numbers on the program.

Lions Club president C. S. Cruzosa named committees for the queen's contest and the 35th anniversary of the club coming up in May.

Lion T. C. Graves, chairman of the nominating committee, made preliminary report for that group.

Copperas Cove boys and girls defeated Santa Anna teams Tuesday night giving them the co-championship spots with Goldthwaite.

This makes the fourth district championship, or co-championship, for the girls in the past four years. They have chalked up a record of winning ten district basketball championships, or co-championships, out of the past 12 seasons, coach Jackie Williams announced.

The girls have won 18 and lost four games this season. This is the first time in many years that the Eagles have taken top honors in the district in basketball. This year they won 20 and lost three games.

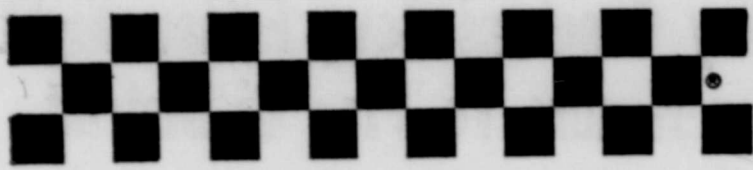

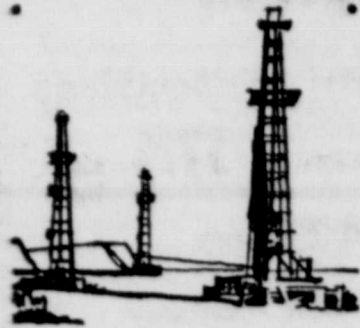

## Screwworm Eradication Program Has Favorable Second Anniversary

The screwworm eradication program has just completed its second full year of operation on a successful note, and even more favorable results are expected in the year ahead.

Only one screwworm infestation has been reported in the five-state eradication area since January 1.

The massive eradication project, which involves the release of millions of sexually-sterile flies that disrupt the insect's reproductive capability, was begun on February 14, 1962.

Since then, more than eight billion screwworm flies, reared in a huge plant near Mission and sterilized through exposure to an atomic energy source, have been released by airplanes in screwworm-infested areas of the Southwest. This technique, along with preventive measures used by farmers and ranchers, has reduced screwworm incidence by more than 99 percent, entomologists say.

With the decrease in infestations in the United States, eradication workers are turning their attention to activities along the border between the U. S. and Mexico. A large portion of the sterile flies will be dispersed in a strip along the border extending from the Gulf of Mexico to a point below the state of Arizona. This barrier is to prevent fertile screwworm flies from migrating out of Mexico and reinfesting the Southwest.

Although screwworm infestations have become a rare occurrence in Texas, eradication workers insist that it is still important for livestock producers to be alert for screwworms in their livestock. Until the barrier has been completely established and thoroughly tested, the pos-

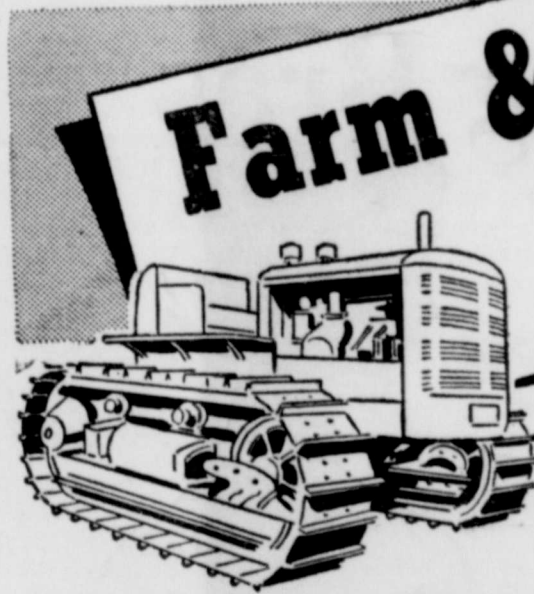

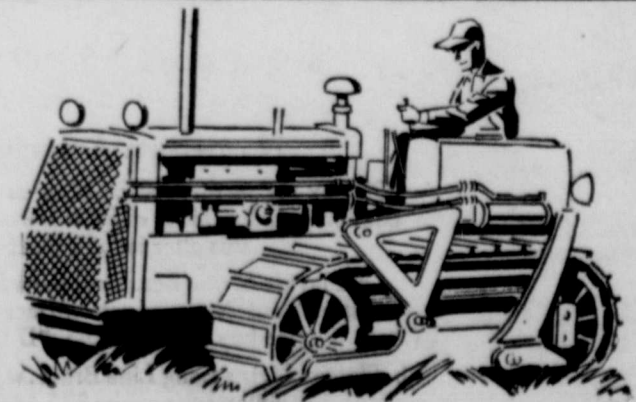
