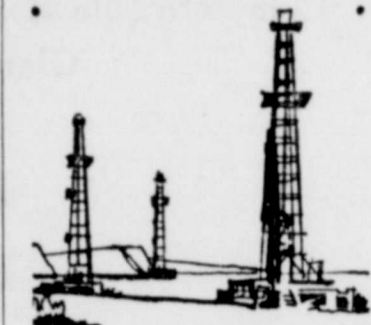
On April 26, 1911 he was married to Miss Lufa Owens in Mills County.
