Many observers state that this is one of the best, if not the best, grain crops covering both wheat and oats Mills County

There have been years when Mills County farmers have experienced good oats or wheat in one year, but this year they were blessed with both. Grain was reportedly of good quality

Wheat yields have been reported running from 15 up to 40 bushels per acre.

Many fields have yielded from 15 to 20 bushels while a number of them went up to 30 bushels and a few went as high as 40 bushels.

Yield in oats ran up to 100 bushels per acre. County Agent George Reese said there was lots of 60 bushel oats this year. Grain men say it is hard to estmiate what the average yield was in this year's oats, but all
