## Council Hears Report On Water Project; Authorizes Purchases

The City Council meeting in regular session Monday night heard report on progress of the water project, authorized purchases of 2 way communications system for the city, cyclone fence for the filter plant, and transacted other routine business.

### WATER PROJECT

City Manager W. C. Barnett, Engineer Bob King and contractor T. A. Mussett reported to the council on the water project.

Contractor is still waiting for some equipment for the filter plant, in order to complete that phase of the water program and get it into full operation.

Engineers will have lab equipment here this week, and the city water department is also receiving some new testing equipment in preparation for getting the filter plant into production.

For the past several weeks the city has been using some of the river water along with water from the city wells while the filter plant was shut down part of the time for some final touches.

The council authorized the purchase of 635 feet of five foot high cyclone fence to be placed around the filter plant at a cost of \$1,307.00, installed.

The area around the filter plant was paved during the past week.

An order was passed by the council for the electric department to be paid from the construction fund for building the power line to the filter plant and the river at a cost of \$18,298.99.

### COMMUNICATIONS

The council authorized purchase of two-way communications system for the city. This will be on a citizen's band with five or six sets for the office and outside vehicle stations. Cost will be approximately \$200.00 per set, according to Barnett's report to the council.

### SEWER REQUEST

A committee composed of M. O. Childress, Glenn Petty, J. D. Kight, Ned Williams and R. T. Padgett appeared before the council with petition requesting extension of sewer line service in their area from Cline street west to the school property.

The matter is to be surveyed as to estimated cost and location of installation.

It has been the policy of the city government to install sewer extensions on a cost share basis with the property owners.

### OTHER BUSINESS

The council heard operating reports of receipts and disbursements for the various departments of the city for the month of August.

Designation of extension of the north end of Reynolds street by 300 feet was accepted by the council. Opening of this street will provide access to new addition for construction of homes.

New tax roll for the city and water district was approved.

An ordinance whereby the highway department will establish speed limits on a three block area of farm to market road on the Moline highway was approved and passed.

The council heard report on street work and the paving of roads in Mills County Park that is now underway.

During the second half, the Eagles managed only two first downs, one of these on a 15 yard penalty. As the game came to an end the Eagles finally managed to cross the 50 yard line.

### EAGLES PLAY DE LEON HERE FRIDAY NIGHT

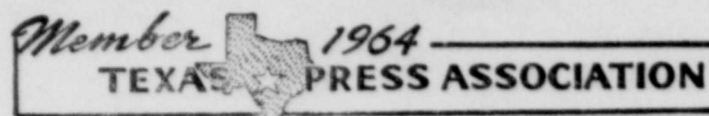
This Friday night the Eagles will play the De Leon team on Eagle field for a home game. This is the first time the Eagles have played in the De Leon ball district.

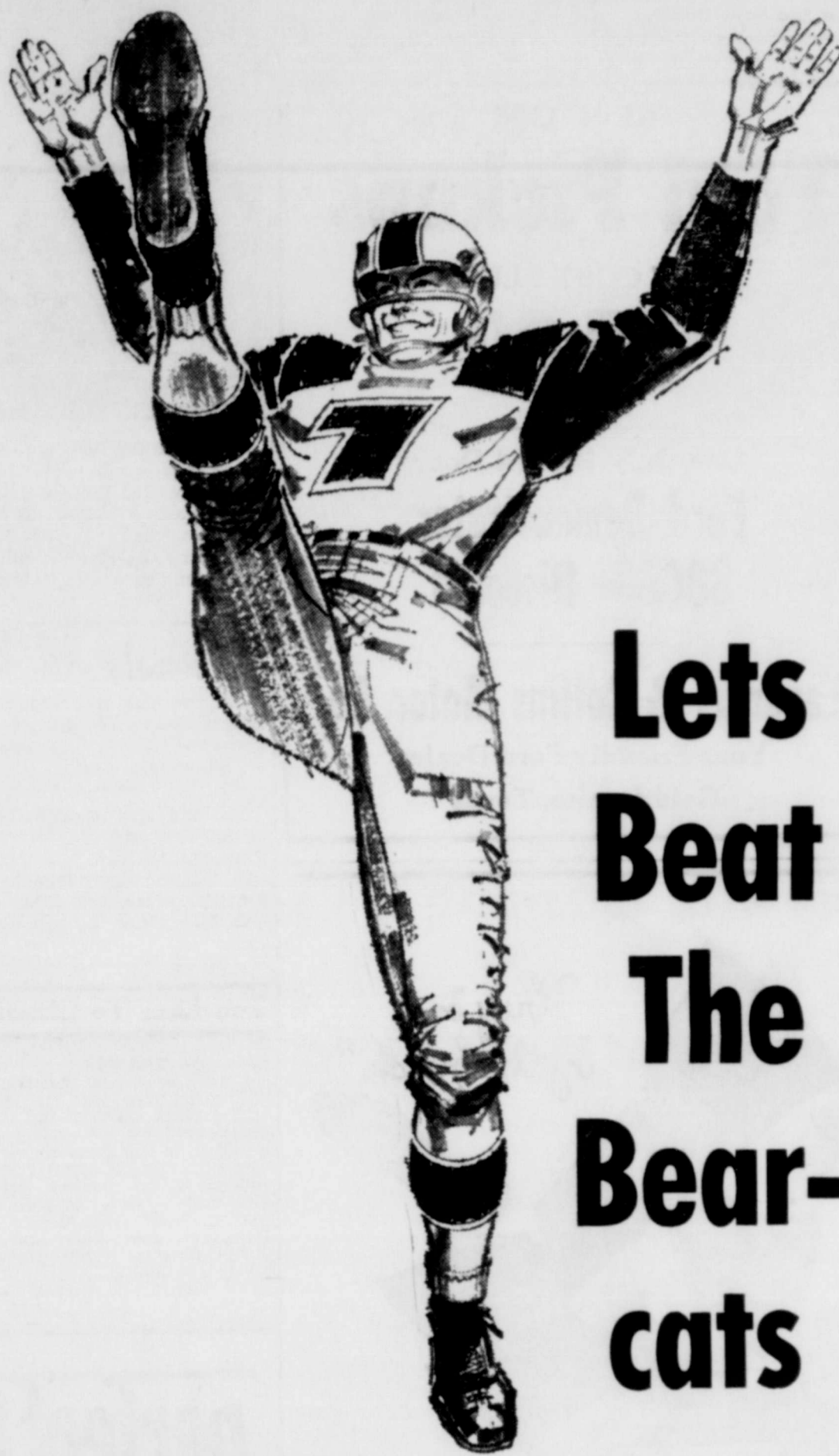
