Aid to families with dependent children came to \$18,700,-000; aid to needy blind to \$4,-000.000; and aid to permanently and totally disabled to \$6,200,-000. Administrative and service costs were \$10,100,000. Federal government provided 74 per cent of all funds, or \$164,600.000.


