Masons Plan Area Workshop Mullin Monday

Workshop has been scheduled for officers and members of the Masonic Lodges in this area at 7:30 p. m., May 24th. The workshop will be held at Mullin High School, Center City, Goldthwaite, Star, and Mullin Lodges especially invited.

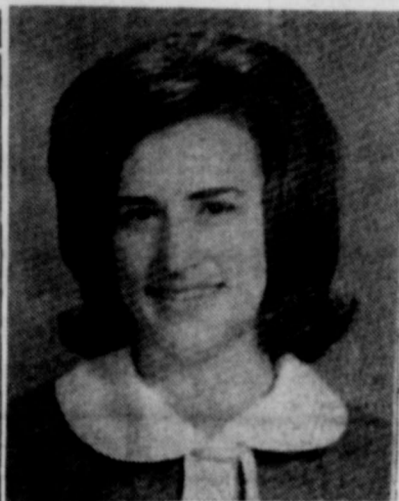
Stores To Close Monday, May 31 To Observe Memorial Day Holiday

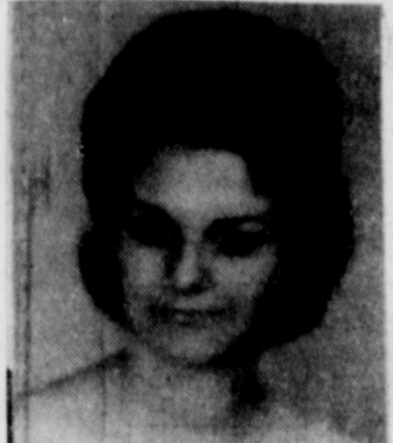

Finance Drive For Rodeo Arena Is Moving Ahead

The finance drive to raise \$5,000.00 for the Mills County FFA Rodeo Association to construct a new FFA Rodeo Arena in Goldthwaite is moving ahead on schedule, it was announced Tuesday.

Truett Auldridge is chairman of the finance committee. Working with him are Don Geeslin, Howard B. Campbell, Delton Barnett, Dick Hughes, Roydston House and V. D. Ables.

Approximately \$1,000.00 was raised during the past week. This along with the \$1,400.00 that was pledged by cash, material and labor at the meeting last week Monday brings the drive near the half-way mark.

The new arena is to be constructed on land owned by the Goldthwaite Independent School District, located north of the Elementary School. The ground has been cleared and is ready for construction work.

Contacts for financial support are being made in Goldthwaite and over the county by members of the finance committee.

The group will accept cash or livestock contributions. Anyone wishing to give livestock may do so and stock will be sold through Mills County Commission Company without commission, officials announced.

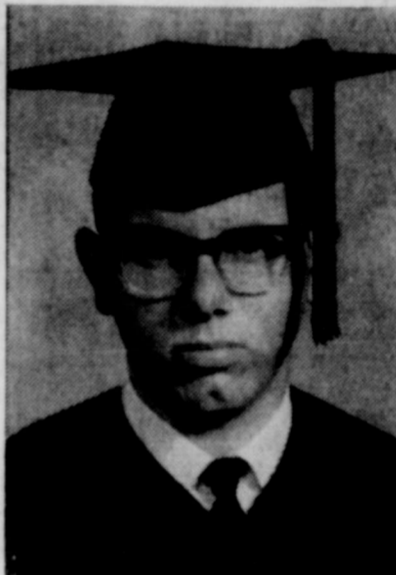

Miss Rhoades has a 93.23 grade average for four years of high school work. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. D. E. Rhoades.

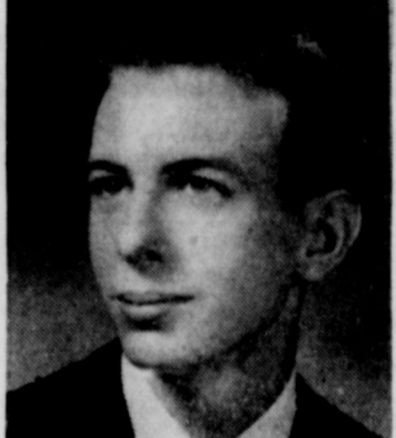
Mr. Wrinkle is the son of Mr. and Mrs. J. M. Wrinkle. His four-year grade average is 93.22.
