

Eagles Win State Championship

Cindermen Take Four First Places; Score 67 Out Of Possible 70 Points

 Bounding to a beautiful lead, Goldthwaite's Eagle cindermen astounded Austin as they claimed the Class A Championship and took first in four out of five events.

To start the afternoon the Eagle sprint relay burned up a 42.7 ending 5 yards ahead of the field of eight. The quartet of James Cook, Gary Warlick, Jerry Rountree, and Charles Blackburn set a new record breaking the old 43.3 set by Idalou in 1965.

On top of being a red letter day for Goldthwaite, it was a

gold medal day for sprinter Charles Blackburn. Anchoring the winning sprint relay, he also swept the 100 yd. dash and the 220.

The Jr. speedster ran 10.2 in the short dash and popped a 22.2 to the record books, upsetting the old 22.4 set in 1964.

While the Eagles performed beautifully on the track, high jumper Kenneth Hollingshead showed his specialty in the field. Even though he tied for second leaping 5' 11 3/4", he lost the coin flip and had to settle for third, adding 7 points to the Eagles' final tally of 67.

Coaches Jackie Williams' and Russell Nalley's tracksters did not want to stop here and decided to show the crowd an equalizer to the sprint relay record set earlier.

From the blocks of the mile relay came Ronnie Hill rounding the track and passing everyone to hand to second leg James Cook. Cook, a step behind Coahoma, put the Eagles back ahead and stretched the lead beautifully handing to Owen Yarborough. Passed up by a surprising Memphis team, Yarborough gave the baton to anchorman Jerry Rountree to finish the relay. Rountree held second till the last corner then lead the Eagles to victory as their 3:21.1 shattered last year's record by over 2 seconds.

This last event ended the Eagles' performances and gave them 67 out of a possible 70 points, almost twice as many as second Coahoma with 36 and third place Pettis with 30.

field office territory are A. B. Hammond, Burnet, Texas, and Roy Lackey, Jr., Lampasas, Texas. The Lampasas field office serves both Burnet and Lampasas Counties. Mr. Elmer R. Smith and Mr. A. B. Hammond are currently serving as directors.

The board of directors of the San Saba Production Credit Association consists of J. C. Ellison, Cherokee, President; Elmer R. Smith, Llano, Vice President; A. B. Hammond, Burnet, O. D. Striegler, Salt Gap, and James M. Green, Mullin. Messrs. Ellison and Hammond, along with Newell A. Oliver, General Manager of the association, comprise the Loan Committee of the association with the three other directors serving as alternates on this committee. Mr. Ben H. Ray of San Saba is the Assistant General Manager.

Membership of the San Saba Production Credit Association consists of about 1,000 farmers and ranchers from an eight county Central Texas area. Loan volume for the current year peaked at over \$7,500,000 in March but is currently at \$6,700,000 due to the very good liquidation resulting from favorable moisture conditions and prices on commodities. Further liquidation is expected from normal spring sales which are not complete as of this date.

Total assets of the Association are \$7,837,181.00 with capital, surplus, and reserves amounting to \$1,706,016.00.

Yeager Wins Treasurer's Race; Vaughan And Thorne In Run-Off

Mrs. Jewell Yeager defeated incumbent Bertha Weathers in a race for Mills County Treasurer in the Democratic Primary election held last Saturday.

Johnny Vaughan and Ernest Thorne were forced to a run-off after a three day race for the office of Justice of the Peace, Precinct 1.

Mrs. Yeager polled 709 votes in the nomination as treasurer while incumbent Mrs. Weathers polled 459, according to official returns. Mrs. Weathers is serving her 2nd year as treasurer.

In the Justice of the Peace race, W. W. "Bill" Fox polled 199 votes, Ernest Thorne received 171 and Johnny Vaughan 271. Less than 1,200 Mills County voters turned out to cast their ballots in the primary election, the first two years ago over 2,100 voted in Mills County.
