Two Highway Projects Approved for Mills County

Construction work on sections of U. S. Highway 84 and Highway 16 in Mills County has been approved by the State Highway Commission. The State Highway Engineer directed to proceed with the reconditioning of shoulders on a 14.4-mile section of U. S. Highway 16 from Farm-to-Market Road east to the Hamilton County line. The project will cost an estimated \$100,000. The project will include the resurfacing of shoulders on a 17.3-mile section of State Highway 84 from the Comanche County line south to U. S. 84 also was approved. This project will cost an estimated \$70,000.

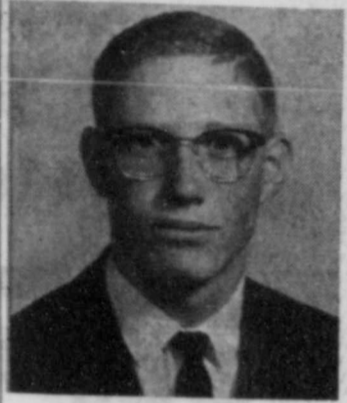
\$1,237.00 Is Contributed To Park Maintenance Fund By 79 Boosters

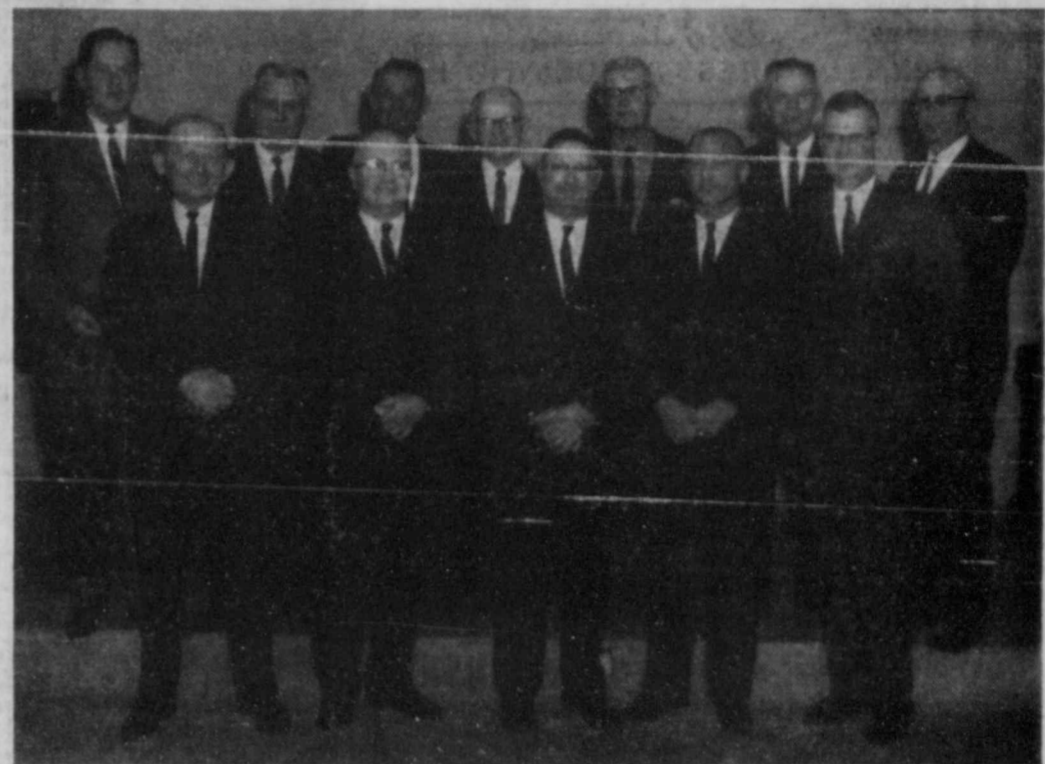
Steering Committee Is Named For Senior Citizens Program
