City Sprayed For Mosquitoes

The City of Goldthwaite re-
ceived a commercial spraying
and fogging Monday afternoon
and night for mosquitoes, flies
and other insects which have
been plentiful since the heavy
August rains.
Weed patches, the city's dump
grounds and alleyways where
there is heavy vegetation were
sprayed Monday afternoon. Mos-
quito harboring areas were also
fogged with chemicals Monday
night.
This same process will be re-
peated again on Monday, Sep-
tember 19, as a health and safety
measure for the community,
it was announced by City Man-
ager W. C. Barnett.

488 Students Enrolled Here

Goldthwaite Schools enrolled
488 students the first week of
school, Supt. LeRoy Beard an-
nounced Tuesday morning.
This is an increase of 12 stu-
dents from the 476 enrolled on
the first day of school last week
Monday.
Of the 488 enrolled students,
254 are enrolled in the elemen-
tary school and 234 in junior
and senior high school grades.
The 7th and 8th grades have 70
and the four high school grades
have 165.
The number of students en-
rolled the first week this year
is 26 less than the 514 students
enrolled the first week of school
last year. It is 4 students less
than the enrollment of 492 in
1964 but is up 9 pupils from the
enrollment of 479 in 1963.

Rural Carriers Will Distribute Acreage Sur. Cards

Acting Postmaster Ray Duren
announced today that Rural
Mail Carriers will begin dis-
tributing 1966 Acreage Survey
Cards to patrons on their routes
about September 14.
The Post Office Department
assists U. S. D. A. in making
this survey each year. These re-
ports, directly from farmers, are
the basis for official estimates
for Texas acreage of all crops
harvested in 1966.
To be sure the community is
well represented in the survey,
Acting Postmaster Duren urges
each patron receiving a card to
fill it out and return it to his
mailbox.

Two; and D. W. Sears, Route 3.

Changes In Electing ASC County Committee Announced By Chairman

Several important changes in
election details, initiated last
year at the county convention
held to elect ASC county com-
mitteemen, are designed to give
more continuity and stability to
operating policies in ASCS
County Offices and to improve
administration of farm pro-
grams by local committees, ac-
cording to Ralph Duren, Chair-
man, Agricultural Stabilization
and Conservation County Com-
mittee. The convention will be
held September 21, 1966 at 9:00
a. m., in the ASCS Office.
The Chairman explained that
the changes are part of a con-
tinuing process to make more
effective use of farmer-com-
mittees in local administration of
programs, to increase their im-
portance and status, and to at-
tract outstanding farm leaders
to serve in these positions.
One change in the convention
elections is that all regular
members of the various com-
munity committees within the
county (instead of the chair-
men only) elect the county
committeemen. Other changes
are that the county committee-
men are elected for 3-year stag-
gered terms (instead of for 1
year), and the service of each
county committeemen will be
limited to three consecutive
terms (previously there has
been no limitation).

ally will elect one member of
each county committee, for a
term of 3 years. Each year, the
convention also elects a first
and a second alternate commit-
teeman, each for a 1-year term.
After the committee members
are elected, the delegates vote
again to determine which of the
regular members are to serve as
the chairman and the vice-
chairman. The conventions re-
determine these positions annu-
ally.
A qualified candidate for ser-
vice on the ASC County com-
mittee is one who is a resident
eligible to vote in one of the
community elections in the
county, and who meets other
eligibility requirements. Eligibil-
ity to hold office as an ASC
county committeeman will be
decided by the incumbent coun-
ty committee subject to appeal
to the State committee; the
convention would proceed, how-
ever, on the basis of the county
committee decision.
Programs administered by
ASC committees are directed to-
wards encouraging conservation
and increasing farm returns by
means of price supports and
market supply-management, as
well as by payments.

pasas to represent Mills County.

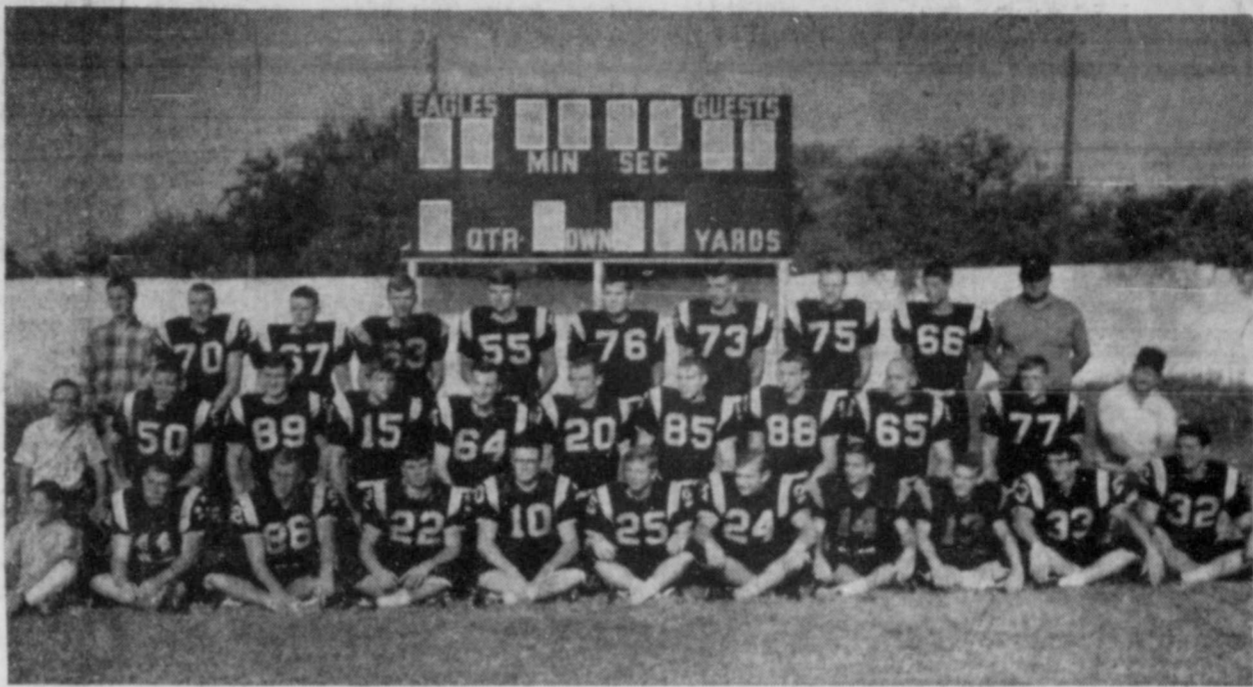
Mr. Williams was appointed

TS&GRA Supports A "Yes" Vote In Sheep Producers Referendum

The Texas Sheep and Goat Raisers' Association supports a "Yes" vote in the upcoming national referendum for sheep producers September 12 to 23, said G. C. Magruder, Jr., president. The referendum will decide whether producers wish to continue to support an industry promotion program which is financed by a deduction from their wool and lamb incentive payments. The deduction is to be increased 50 per cent to 1½ cents a pound on wool and 7½ cents per cwt. on lamb if the referendum carries.

Magruder, of Mertzon, pointed out that the competitors of wool and lamb spend hundreds of millions of dollars each year in advertising and promoting their products. The sheep producers' dollars go into national advertising in leading big-circulation publications, into education in home economics classes at both high school and college levels, into promotional programs designed to encourage retailers and their employees to recommend wool and lamb to

their customers, into such publicity-winning campaigns as the Miss Wool program and the Make - It-Yourself-With - Wool contests.

Magruder pointed to encouraging signs in the sheep industry. Wool prices to the producer for the first six months of this year are running more than 11 per cent ahead of the first six months of 1962—the last time a referendum was conducted. Mill consumption for apparel wool use was up 15 per cent the first four months of 1966. Lamb prices the first six months of 1966 were up 7 per cent from 1965 and 23 per cent from the average of the last four years.
