A handoff to Bobby Rountree on the second down play put the Eagles on the Mustangs' 5 vard line as Rountree ran around the end zone for a gain of 50 vards.

On the second down and one yard to goal Quarterback Mike Conradt carried the ball into the end zone for the first touchdown of the ball game and his first touchdown of the season.

The kick for extra point failed but the Eagles were on their way to victory with only a minute and thirty seconds of the game behind them.

The Eagles, who did a beautiful job of holding the Mustangs. forced them to kick on their fourth down.

Blackburn's 40 yard run and with the help of the yardage made by Rountree put the Eagles in good shape on the 17 yard line of the Mustangs.

First down and 2 minutes and 46 seconds left in the first frame was the setup for the Eagles when a pitchback by Conradt to Rountree put the Eagles two touchdowns ahead of the Mustangs.
