Additions Announced For Star Library

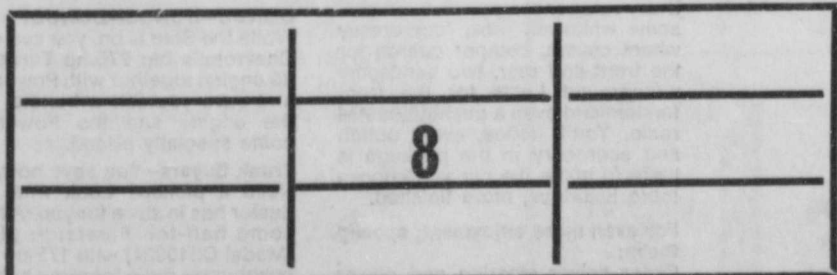

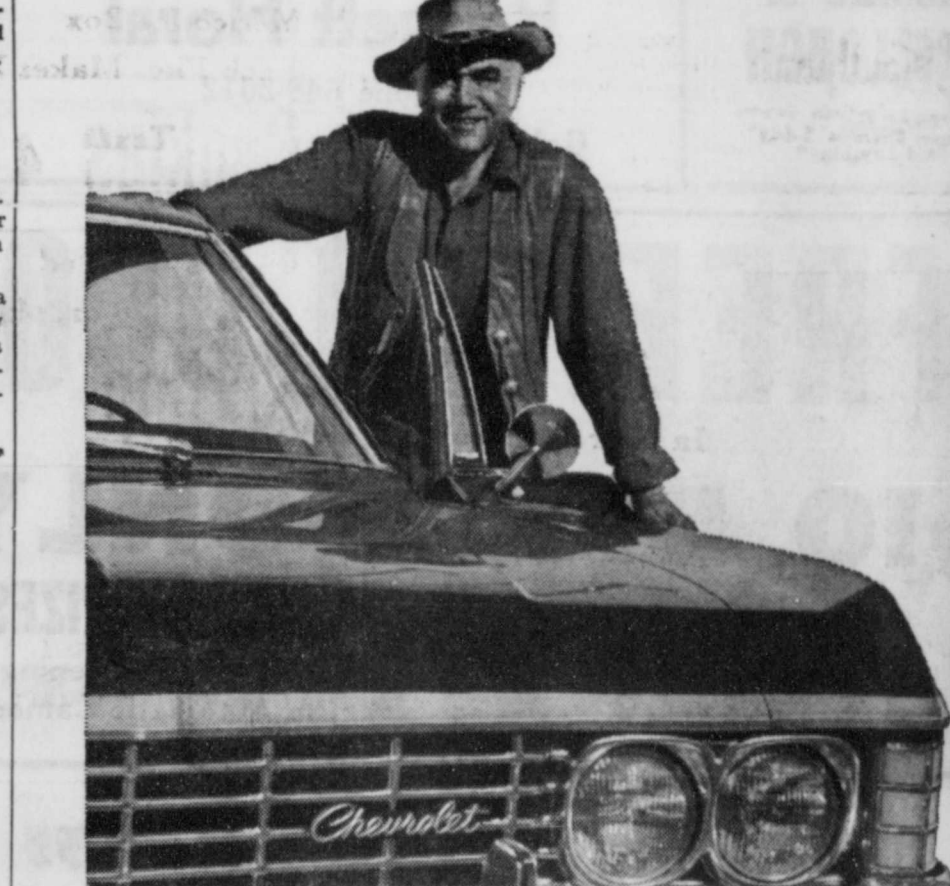
Bond Sales Goal For '67 Announced By Chairman Duren
