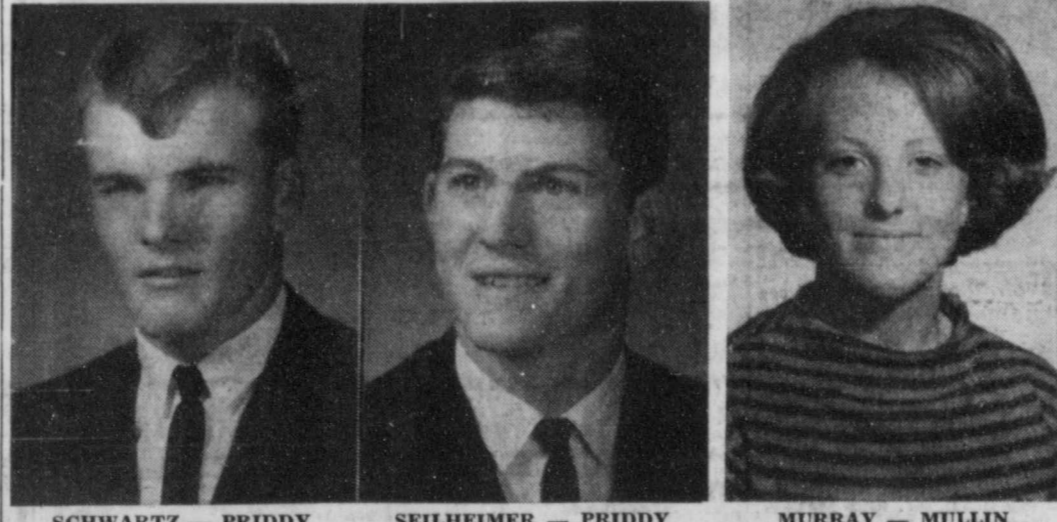

Running the sprint relay will be James Berry, Sam Campbell, Harold Moore and Gary Warlick clocked at 44.5.

Campbell will also run the intermediate hurdles (42.9) and the high hurdles (16.8).

Mike Conradt will be entered in the high jump with best record of 5' 10".

Bobby Burns will be representing the Eagles in the pole vault making best season record of 12' 1".

Running the 100 and 200 yard dashes will be sprinter Warlick clocked at 9.9 and 22.5.

Eagles Mac Rowlett (51") in the Shot and Ted Jones (131") in the Discus are also entered in the regional meet.

Last Saturday Eagle tracksters came out 5th as they journeyed to Comanche. With mostly regional qualifiers participating, here's how the Eagles fared.

Warlick was the only 1st taken by the Eagles as he sacked the 100 yard dash in 10.2. He ran a close second in the 220, clocked at 22.9.

Field events again helped the Eagles' point situation. In the high jump Mike Conradt placed 3rd, leaping 5' 4", while Sam Campbell placed 6th. Shot put man Mac Rowlett heaved the shot 49' 1/4" to place 3rd while Ted Jones took 6th in the discus.

The sprint relay (James Berry, Sam Campbell, Harold Moore, and Gary Warlick) clocked to show up 4th in the finals.

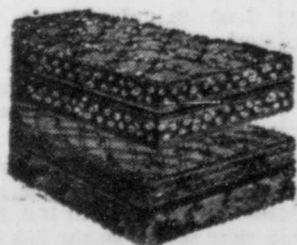

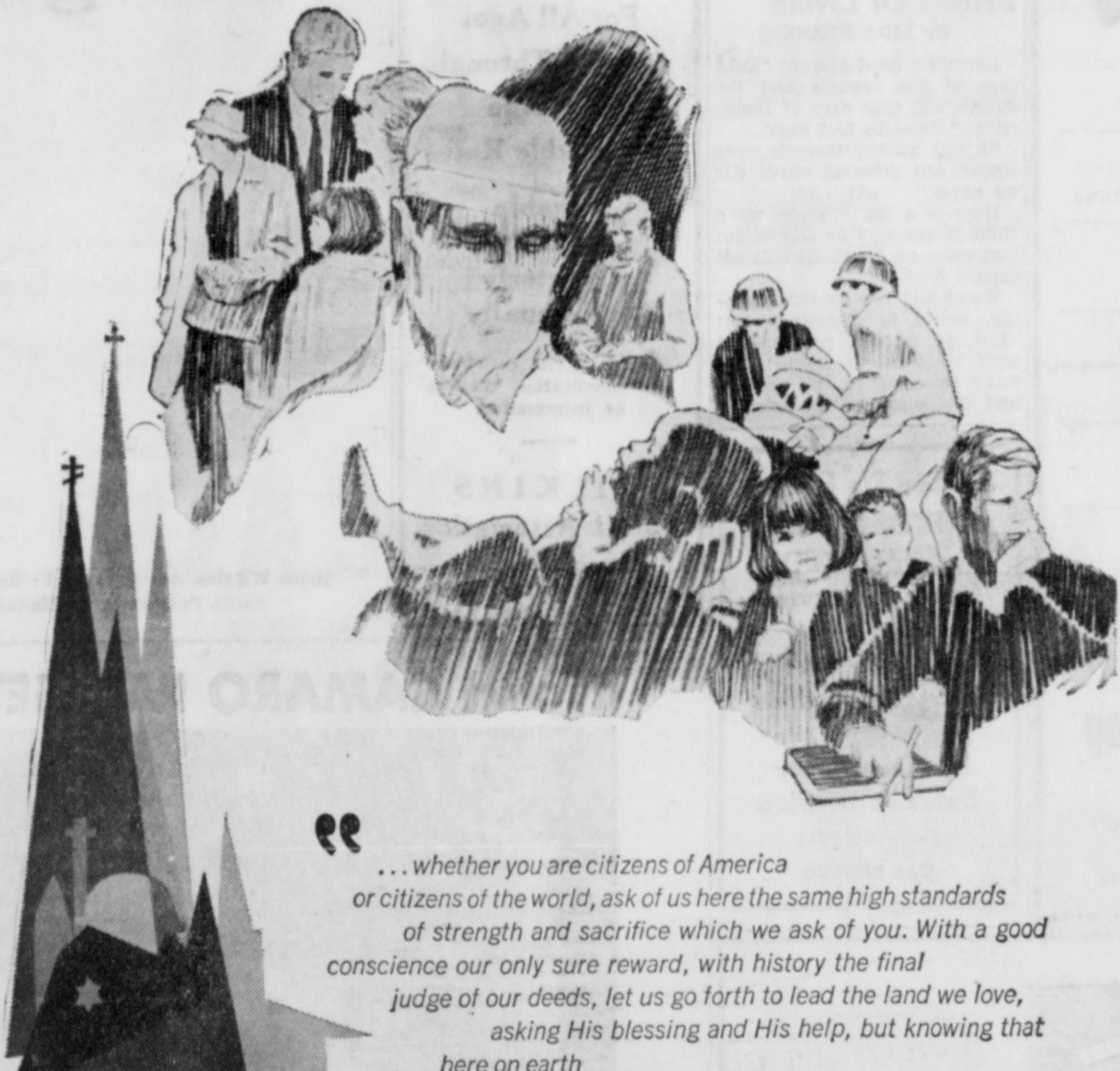

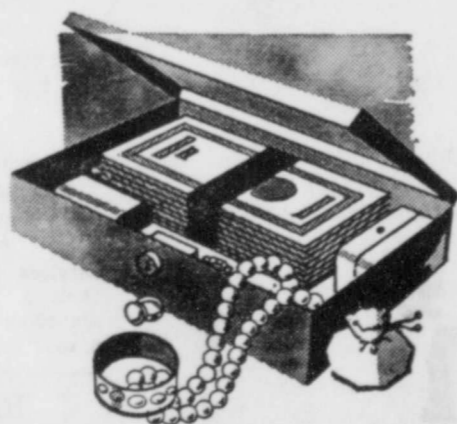

SEWING MACHINE CARE

If you expect your sewing machine to give you the greatest service and satisfaction, you can't neglect proper care. To guarantee perfect operation, home sewers need to clean, oil, and lubricate their machines regularly. Refer to the instruction book for specific care information and always for motor care and instruction.

After you have completed a garment, remove lint and fluff from the take-up lever, thread guides, tension discs, bobbin case and machine surface with a soft, clean cloth. If necessary, dampen the cloth to clean the machine surface, but don't use a detergent.

Then with a lint brush clean the feed dog and hook or thread-handling areas under the throat and slide plates. After each cleaning, apply a drop of sewing machine oil to these areas. For specific oiling points, refer to the sewing machine instruction book. After oiling, always sew a few lines of stitching on a scrap of material to remove excess oil. Also, if the

machine is not to be in use, leave un-threaded with the needle through a piece of fabric to take up excess oil in storage. Every few months, clean the area behind the face plate and oil the top and bottom of the machine in the oil holes.

If the machine is to be stored, clean all exposed parts and areas behind the face plate. Swab these parts with a lint brush saturated in sewing machine oil to protect the machine from rust. Rust damage is more likely to occur when the machine is stored in a closed closet than when the machine is kept open to the air. Keep a small piece of fabric under the pressure foot with the needle down through it to protect the foot and feed from damage. When the pressure foot is down, the pressure spring is released and its life prolonged.

often becomes a burden for some older folks and one-member "families." Buying food for one or two may be made easier by keeping these tips in mind.

1. Buy no more than can easily be used. A large economy-sized package or a large quantity of specially priced food is no bargain if it becomes spoiled or disliked before it is used.
2. Compare prices on the basis of price per serving rather than price per pound.
3. Keep up-to-date on the current food prices, purchasing those foods that are plentiful — these usually cost less.
4. Canned meat and fish may be less expensive than fresh meat. They can be stored on the pantry shelf, but they do require more imagination for interesting preparation.
5. Split peas, dried beans and peanut butter, when used with

a good protein source such as milk, eggs or cheese, provide a good buy for main dishes.

6. Cottage cheese, liver, and fish are bargains in food value. Bacon is often a luxury.

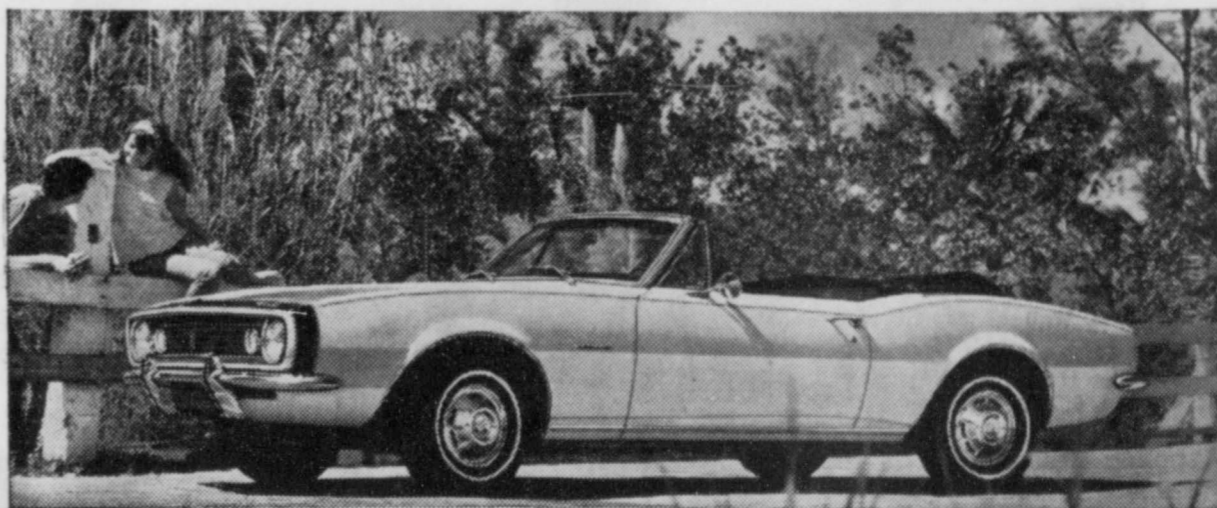

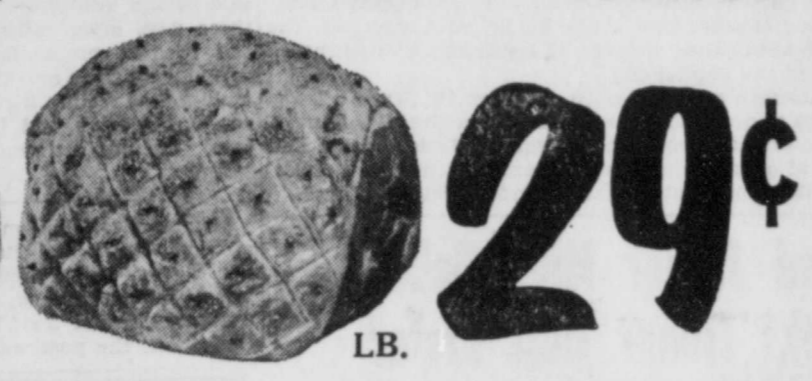

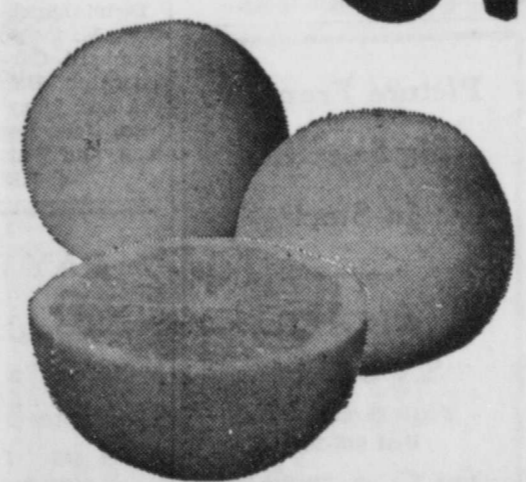
