60th Legislature Approves Twenty Proposed Changes In Constitution

Six proposed changes in the Texas Constitution were approved by the 60th Legislature for submission to the voters this fall—November 11.

These proposals are as follows:

- SJR 6 authorizing counties to pay medical, doctor and hospital bills of county law enforcement officers injured in line of duty.
- HJR 12 providing for a \$74,000,000 parks development fund bond issue.
- HJR 17 reviving the Veterans' Land Program and authorizing a total of \$400,000,000 in bonds.
- HJR 3 allowing counties to put tax money in one general fund.
- HJR 27 permitting state officers and employees to hold other non-elective positions under the state or U. S. governments where there is no conflict of interests and where the state might actually benefit.
- HJR 37 allowing cities and other units within hospital districts to levy taxes for participation in mental health and mental retardation community centers.

Rev. Philip Riley, pastor of the First Methodist Church in Goldthwaite for the past three years, has been appointed to the pastorate of the Catulla Church, according to official announcement of appointments for the new year.

Appointments of pastors for the coming year were made Sunday by Bishop O. Eugene Slater of San Antonio at the close of the 1967 Annual Meeting of the Southwest Texas Conference of the Methodist Church.

Rev. Jack Perry is the new pastor for the Goldthwaite Church. He comes to Goldthwaite from Eagle Pass.

Rev. E. C. Young was re-appointed to the Star-Center City churches.

City Council Meets Monday In Routine Session

The City Council met in a routine session Monday night in the City Hall.

Monthly operating reports of receipts and disbursements for the month of May were presented to the council by City Manager W. C. Barnett.

The council voted to have the city sprayed and fogged for flies, mosquitoes and other insects again this season.

A committee was appointed, composed of W. C. Barnett, V. A. Hudson and J. C. Wesson to investigate purchase of a new truck for the garbage department to replace the old truck.

The Council heard a request from Claudia Cockrum for water service to her home which is outside the city limits and water district. The Council agreed that this can be done on the same basis as it has in the past provided the property is brought into the water district.

It was reported that members of the council have received numerous complaints from residents of the city about poor service in connection with long distance telephone calls, and also regarding the Micro-Wave TV service here.

Some complaints stated that they have waited as much as 10 to 30 minutes for long distance operator to answer.

The council went on record to write a letter to the Telephone Company at Brownwood informing the company that a number of people are unhappy with the long distance service and also with the local service setup as it is being handled through the Brownwood office.

The group also voted to write to the Cable Vision Company to register a complaint about the Micro Wave service in local TV.

You may be required to pay a service charge for collecting a check which cannot be processed electronically by the Federal Reserve banks.

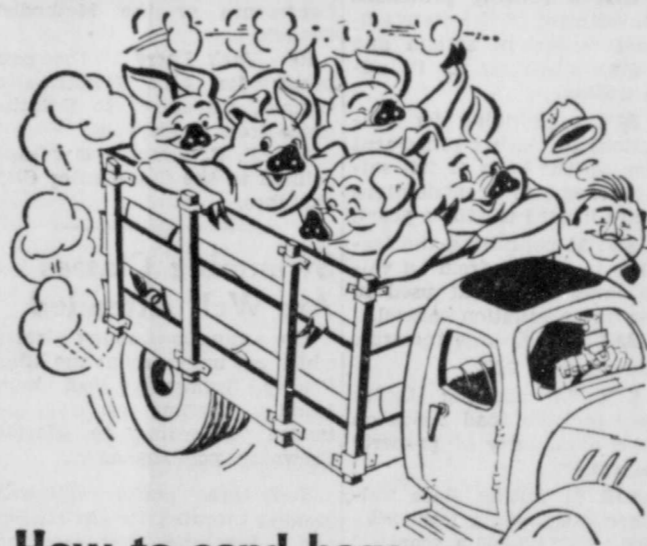

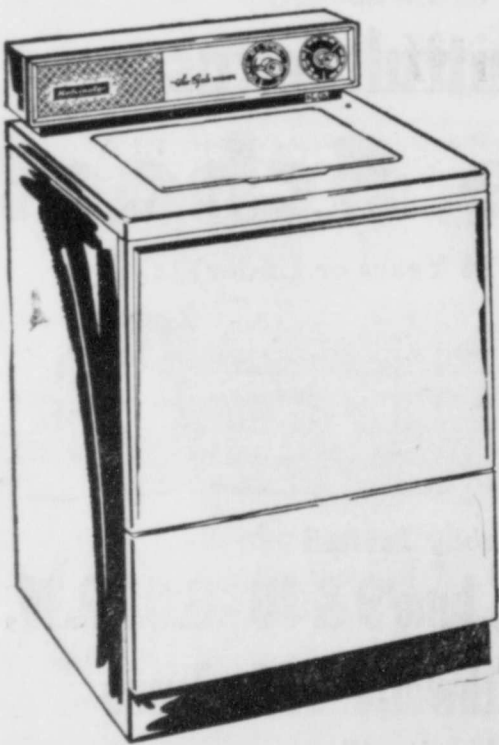

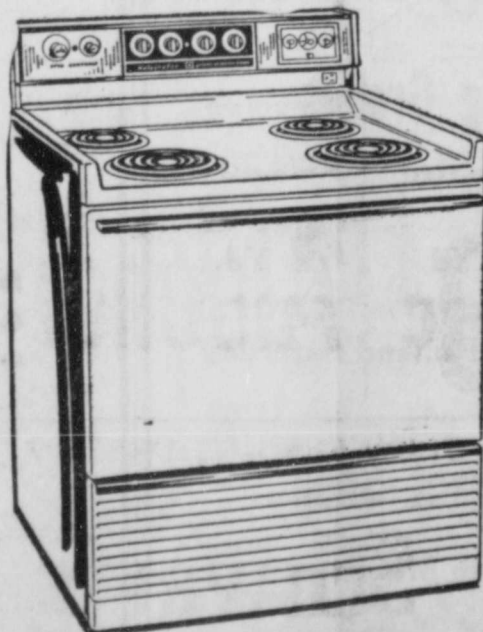

News From Your COUNTY HOME DEMONSTRATION AGENT

NEWS BRIEFS:

Necy Murray, Kay Fisher, Douglas Meier, and Larry Alexander will be Mills County representatives at the District 8 4-H Leadership Development Congress to be held on the Carleton State College campus June 13, 14 and 15. The group will accompany the Home Demonstration Agent to Stephenville. Boys and girls from all 20 counties will participate in developing and presenting programs for the group during congress. Necy, Douglas and Larry are president of their respective 4-H Clubs. Kay will serve as president of the Goldthwaite 4-H Chapter in 1967-68.

The Mills County 4-H Camp will be held Monday, June 19 at Lake Merritt, 10:30 a. m. to 9:00 p. m. Plans were made at the 4-H Council meeting for the camp to be carried out as in previous years. Each 4-H'er is to bring his own sack lunch. 4-H Council will furnish ice and bottle drinks. Those planning to swim will need a written permit from their parents.

WHAT IS AN IRISH POTATO?
According to Webster, it's the "underground tuber of a giant of the night-shade family."
Potatoes have helped make history; a war was named for them; pirate ships fought over them. Potatoes have averted famine and caused mass migrations of people when crop failures caused it to be in short supply. In fact, the importance of potatoes as a staple food has increased through the ages until today, the annual world production exceeds five billion hundredweight.

Where did the potato come from? Nobody is quite certain.

It is known to have originated somewhere in South America. Records show that potatoes were known to the Incas long before the Spanish explorations. Dried potatoes have been found in graves in Chile, Peru, and Ecuador, which archaeologists have determined were interred with the dead in pre-Columbian times.

Spanish explorers used potatoes for food and ship's provisions. They took seed potatoes back to Spain as part of their bounty and began potato culture in that country in the middle of the 16th century. Sir Francis Drake, it is said, introduced potatoes to England's dinner tables. With this introduction, the potato traveled the width and breadth of the European continent. They found their greatest popularity with the Irish who were near starvation in the 16th century. Potatoes soon became the mainstay of Irish diets. Small wonder that this food earned the name of "Irish Potatoe."

The potato first came to North America in 1719. A colony of settlers brought seed potatoes with them when they arrived at Londonderry, New Hampshire. These newly arrived Americans were Irish and knew the food value of the potato. Again its popularity increased. Today the average American eats some 100 pounds of potatoes each year, according to the U. S. Department of Agriculture.

USDA market news reports heavy shipments of potatoes moving into trade channels now. So it's an especially good time to perk up menus with lots of potato dishes.

For a tasty combination treat, try "Onions and Potato Charlene"—

3 cups peeled and quartered onions; 3 cups peeled and quartered potatoes; 1 1/2 cups evaporated milk; 1/2 cup cream; 3 tablespoons butter; salt, pepper, and cayenne.

Simmer potatoes and onions in salted water to cover. When tender, drain; and add evaporated milk, cream and butter. Season to taste with salt, pepper and cayenne pepper. Simmer until thoroughly heated.

POTATO PANCAKES

4 large potatoes
1 small onion
1/2 cup milk
1 teaspoon salt
1 beaten egg
2 tablespoons flour
fat for frying.
Peel and grate potatoes and onion. Add milk, mix with remaining ingredients except fat. Heat fat in heavy frying pan and drop batter into hot fat. Brown on both sides and serve at once.

For "Dixie Fries," dip lengthwise strips of uncooked potatoes and individual onion rings in milk and then roll in bread crumbs. Fry in deep fat until crispy.
