



White-Wing Count **Drops 17 Per Cent**

White-winged dove census counts, just completed in the nesting areas of the Lower Rio Grande Valley, indicate a 17 per cent decline in the breeding population, according to Bill Brownlee, wildlife biologist for the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.

Even with the decline, 1967 can be classified as the third best of recent years, Brownlee said. This year's count shows 667,000 birds while there were 804,000 in 1966, he said.

The best crop in recent years was in 1950 when more than a million birds were counted.

On the other hand, if someone else provides support for one of your dependents, but you plan on claiming the dependency, you must keep a record of the amount of support you provided in rent, clothing, food, medical expenses, educational expenses and other normal support expense. Only one person can claim the dependent. You must provide principal support or more than 50% to be entitled to the deduction. It pays to work out the problems without IRS help.






