## Eagle Political Calendar Now Open; Little Politics Talked In County

The Goldthwaite Eagle Political Calendar is now open and announcements will be published and names listed in the calendar as candidates announce for office.

There is little talk of politics on the local level as the time rolls around for opening the political calendar for candidates to announce for the 1968 elections.

Several prospective candidates have made inquiries and expressed an interest in the forthcoming election coming up.

Some state wide candidates have already tossed their hats

into the ring and more are expected to do so within the next few weeks.

On the local level five offices will be filled for four year terms in the 1968 elections. The places up for election the coming year are: county sheriff, tax assessor and collector; county attorney; commissioner for precincts one and three; and county surveyor.

Claudia Cockrum, chairman of the Mills County Democratic Executive Committee, said Tuesday that she has heard little talk of politics to date.

The State Legislature changed the election dates eight years ago from July and August to May and June. The first primary election will be held on the first Saturday in May instead of the last Saturday in July. The run-off election will be held in June instead of August, which was customary for Texans for many years.

Along with the primary elections being moved up two months the filing deadline also is moved up from May to February.

It used to be customary for candidates to make their announcements in the paper starting January 1. This also has been moved up to give the candidates their normal amount of time for campaigning.

Next year, 1968, will be a presidential election year with plenty of speculation already about the campaign on the national level. There will also be the general run of state and district offices up for election.

Coach Les Johnson's GHS Eagles took a hard earned 12-8 victory over the Burnet Bulldogs in a non-district game here Friday night. Senior Gary Warlick proved the difference for the Eagles by kicking two field goals from 25 and 22 yards out.

The Bulldogs received the ball on the kick-off, and on a second-down pass, Kent Geeslin intercepted and returned the ball 17 yards for the Eagles.

Then with one yard to go, Danny Spradley plunged over for the Eagles' lone touchdown. Warlick's kick for extra points was blocked, putting the score at 6-0 halfway into the first quarter.

Thirty seconds before half-time, Mike Wright returned a Bulldog punt 26 yards to make way for Warlick's first field goal. With Wright holding, Warlick booted the ball 25 yards for three points making the score 9-0 at the half.

The third quarter saw some fine action from the Eagles. Mike Wright and Mike Conratt each intercepted a pass, and QB Ted Roberts completed a pass to Conratt for 20 yards.

Warlick kicked his second field goal early in the fourth period on a fourth down, from 22 yards out, giving the Eagles a 12 point margin.

Joe Cox (32) accounted for the Bulldogs' TD in the final part of the game, when he received a 30-yard pass from Royce Smith (83). A run by Smith gave the Bulldogs two extra points, making the final score of the game 12-8.

At the last of the game, Mike Wright intercepted two more Bulldog passes giving him a total of three interceptions for the night.

According to Coach Johnson the Eagles' defense carried them through the game. "The defense looked real sharp all the way through the game. Warlick's kicking got us out of the fire and we were lucky to win."

## Jesse Cockrum Gaillardian Nominee For SWTSC Homecoming Festivities

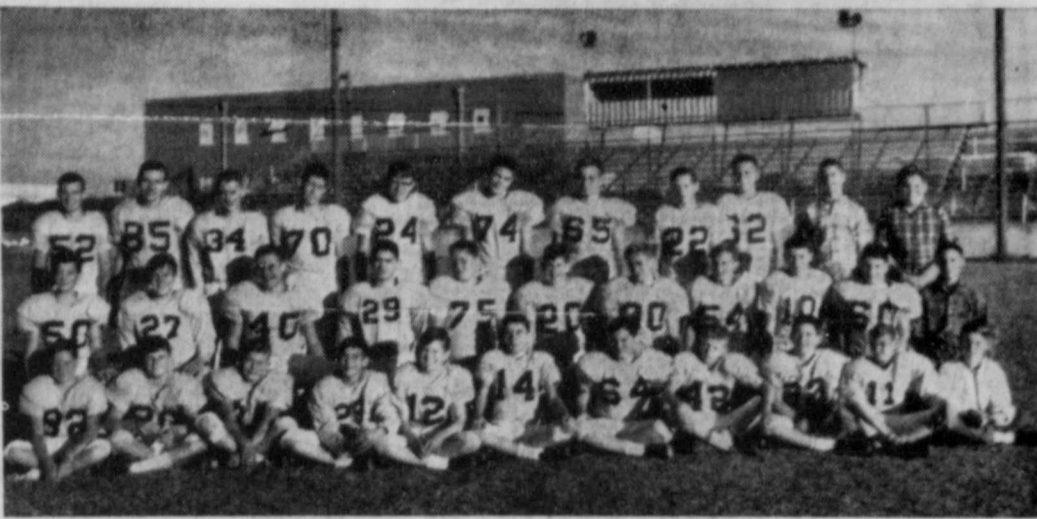

## Mills County Voter Registrations Are Reported Going Well

Voter registrations in Mills County for 1968 are going well, according to announcement Tuesday by H. G. Brooks, Sheriff, Tax Assessor-Collector.

As of Tuesday morning 776 had registered to vote for the new year.

With that many registering during the first 30 days of voter registration it reflects a good trend in voter interest for the coming presidential election next year.

## WEATHER REPORT

Goldthwaite received 1.05 inches of moisture, according to official report from Harry Allen, weatherman. This brings the total for October to 1.61 inches.

Some parts of the county reported up to about 2 inches of rain Sunday night and Monday.

The low temperature reading here Monday was 39 degrees while the high reading was only 46.

## Cattle Testing Gets Underway Here For Brucellosis Re-Certification

Testing cattle for re-certification of Brucellosis in Mills County is scheduled to get underway this week, according to announcement by County Agent George Reese and Mills County Livestock Inspector, Joe Davis.

Every three years a Modified Brucellosis free county needs to be retested. Records indicate that there are 892 herds with 14,890 eligible cattle in the county. The testing was scheduled to begin on or about November 1.

Robert Streit, a representative of the Animal Health Division Agency, will be assigned to Mills County.

During the period December 31, 1964 to date, a total of 391 herds of 1,073 cattle were tested under the market cattle testing program, revealing four reactors.

The total cattle tested under MCTP at this time is approximately one-half of the 15 per cent minimum requirement in the Uniform Methods and Rules. Additional testing of at least 101 herds totaling at least 1,717 animals must be done in order to qualify Mills County.

The additional testing should be done in herds not tested during the previous certification period.

## Industrial Team Training Course Scheduled To Start November 13

Plans were approved Tuesday night for a six session Industrial Team training course to be conducted here starting Monday night, November 13. Sessions will be for two hours, from 7 to 9 p. m., each Monday night for four weeks. The fifth session will be a prospect visitation program conducted during the daytime while the sixth session will be the windup in the form of a critique, for a 7 to 9 p. m. session.

The training course will be for the 27 members of the nine committees appointed by the executive committee of the Industrial Foundation and officers of the organization.

Committee members met in a special called session Tuesday night in the hospitality room of Mills County State Bank to make plans for the forthcoming training course. This is part of the long range program of the Industrial Foundation which was organized recently.

B. R. Hatley, Lone Star Gas Company, Community Industrial Development Specialist, met with the group Tuesday night to help set up the program. Mr. Hatley will conduct the training course.

Also meeting with the group was John Babcock, from the LCRA general office in Austin. He pledged support from that organization to help the local foundation in compiling basic economic information on the Goldthwaite community.
