Winter Mite Causing Damage To Small Grain

Winter grain mite is causing considerable damage to fall-sown small grains. They cause the tips of the leaves to brown and the plants to become stunted. Heavily infested fields have a grayish or silvery appearance, according to County Agent George Reese.

The adult has reddish-orange legs and the body is dark brown with a bluish cast. This pest feeds only at night, remaining around the base of the plant during the day. The mites, retarded during hot, dry periods, do their greatest damage during winter and early spring. Cool and moist conditions are necessary for mite development.

Several of the phosphorus compounds give satisfactory control of the mite. Parathion at 25 pound per acre or Malathion at 5 to 7.5 pound per acre applied as a spray give adequate control for the winter grain mite in small grains.

One should remember that there is a waiting period of 15 days for Parathion and 7 days for Malathion between spraying and grazing small grains with livestock, Reese stated.

Mrs. Freeland submitted a paper to the judges for consideration in making their selection.

Following is a copy of her paper.

EARLY BACKGROUND IN EDUCATION

"First grade (1931) found me—I don't remember finding it—in a schoolhouse that consisted of one room and two 'paths.' (Editor's Note: This was Rock Springs in Mills County.) It housed the first through the fourth grade. There were four in my first grade class and a total of twenty students in the school. The schoolhouse was cooled in the warm months by opening the windows, and heated in the winter months with a wood stove.

"The woodpile and a hoe held the position of Assistant Principal in charge of discipline.

During the winter a few trips to the woodpile cooled (literally) one's enthusiasm for disciplinary desecration. It was assumed by me that 'girls' would be exempt from woodpile duty. May I hasten to add that this was not the case. The hoe replaced the woodpile during the warm months. 'Disciplinary Action' meant you would hoe the weeds out of the 'path' after school. (The woodpile cured me!)

"I felt that I had 'arrived' in the world of education when I entered the fifth grade in the Big Valley School. Fifth through eighth grades were taught there with a room for each grade—still two 'paths.' Incidentally, both the stoves and woodpile were large. When I reached the eighth grade, Homemaking was required and it was here that I met the teacher who was to guide and encourage me for years to come—and I might add—still does.

"Then came the transition to high school—the city school—in Goldthwaite, Texas. I didn't know such a large school existed. There must have been at least one-hundred and fifty students. I did find my place and was active in many interscholastic league activities. My special interests were debate and sports. When I graduated, my eighth grade Homemaking teacher, Mrs. Philip Nickols, encouraged me to go to college."

Mills County Farmers Will Receive Report Of Payments By ASCS Office

Farmers will benefit from a new reporting service which has been inaugurated by ASCS, Roy T. Cozart, Office Manager of the Mills County ASCS County Office, announced today.

A report of payments made to each farmer under ACP, cotton, feed grain, wheat, wool, mohair, and other direct payment programs during 1967 will be mailed to the farmer during the latter part of January.

This report is expected to be helpful in preparing individual income tax returns. The same information must also be furnished to the Internal Revenue Service in accordance with a requirement of law.

It is estimated that over three million farmers will receive this report, he said. This information is being gathered from county offices and summarized by computers located at New Orleans and Kansas City. The reports are being printed by the computers and mailed direct to farmers. A job of this size could not be completed without an automated system, added Mr. Cozart.

Since this is the first year for a service of this magnitude, there are bound to be a few problems. He suggested that farmers carefully read the explanation on the report and check the accuracy of the total reported by comparing it with farm records.

If an error is discovered, the nearest ASCS county office should be contacted to have the mistake corrected. County offices have been instructed to give farmers whatever assistance they need regardless of where the farm is located.

Health Officer Given Results Of Mosquito Survey

Dr. M. A. Childress, city health officer, has been informed about the results of the recent mosquito survey in Goldthwaite by the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, and the State Department of Health.

The report stated that the mosquito known as Aedes aegypti was not present in Goldthwaite.

The mosquito Culex quinquefasciatus was present however. This mosquito is the common house mosquito and does not carry any infectious disease, the report concluded.
