## New Drivers License Regulations Going Into Effect January 1, 1968

Some of the new regulations of Public Safety, are as follows: All Texas Drivers License must be taken in to one of the Drivers License Offices, for renewal; Every person that brings a Drivers License in for renewal

will have their picture taken, to be put on the Drivers License; and also every person will have a visual check at this time.

If you have an Operators License that has a number ending in an "odd" number, the license will be renewed for a 2 year period, this 2 year period to start on the next birthday after the expiration date of the present license;

Example: An operators license number 217381 expires 9-28-68; The person holding this license has birthday 10-15-68; The license would be renewed to expire 10-15-70. Cost \$3.00.

If you have an Operators license that has a number ending in an "even" number, the license will be renewed for a 4 year period, this four year period to start on the next birthday after the expiration date of the present license;

Example: An Operators License number 4176632 expires 7-5-68; The person holding this license has birthday 4-13-68; The license would be renewed to expire 4-13-73. Cost \$6.00.

All Original Applications for a Texas Drivers License must have proof of birth date, (Birth Certificate) and also will have their thumb prints on the application.

NOTE: There is No Increase in Fees for Drivers License: \$3.00 for Two Years (Operators License); \$6.00 for Four Years (Operators License).

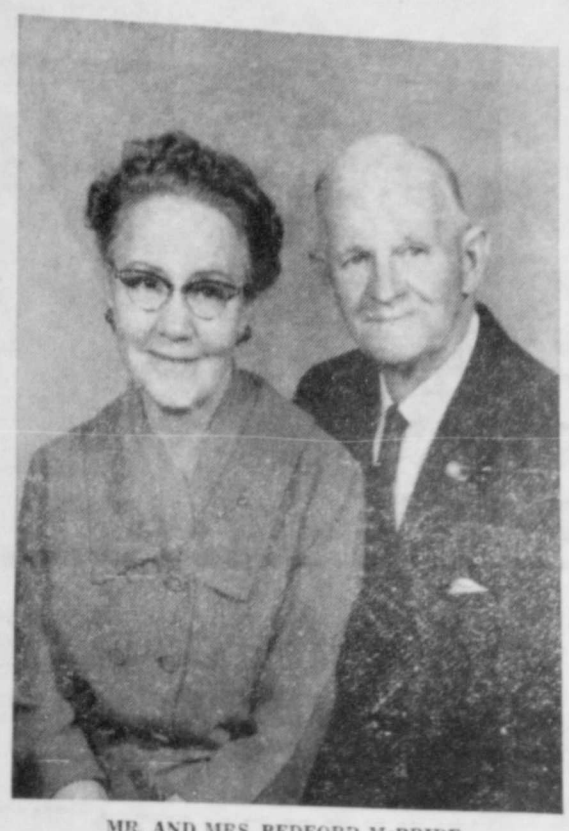

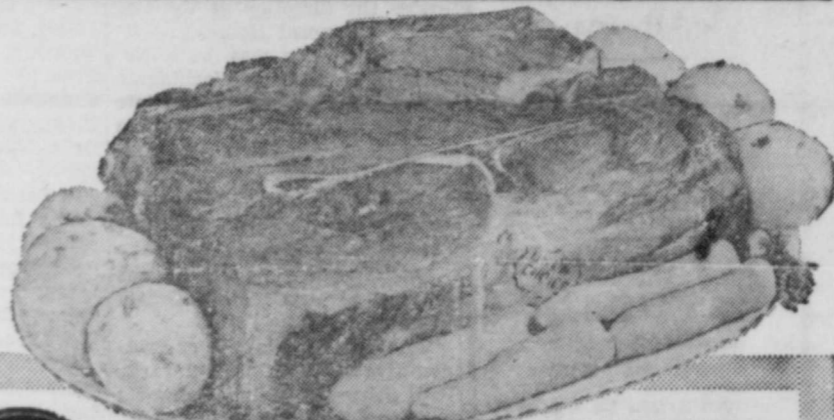
