73 Inches Rainfall Here Six Months

Local weatherman Harry Robertson measured 22.73 inches of rain in Goldthwaite during the first six months of this year through June. The total amount 3.34 inches was recorded in June. The six months total rainfall recorded here for this year is more than triple the amount recorded here during corresponding months last year, which measured only 6.67 inches. In 1966 during the six months 13.33 inches was recorded here. This is a record of precipitation by months for this area.

Registrations of Purebred Animals During the Past Year

Registrations of purebred animals during the past year totaled 17,618 animals, a 46% increase above year earlier figures. The increase was due to a rise of 41% in more and more new breeders enter the picture. Membership increased to 5,676 members, a 10% increase over new members the previous year. There are now approximately 183,183 registered animals in the association's herd book and appendix, a national herd of 243,098.

set somewhat of a record, if not the record in calf production, by having 14 calves in a period of nine years, it was announced here this week by County Agent George Reese. Lee is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Roth Robertson who reside on the Moline Route. The cow, "East Texas," gave birth to twin calves again this year after having a single and twins on alternate years for the past six years. Robertson purchased the grade Hereford in 1959 and starting with 1960 she has brought the owner five single calves, three sets of twins and triplets. She delivered a single in 1960 and 1961, followed by triplets in 1962. Starting in 1963 through 1968 there were three singles and three sets of twins. All of her calves lived with the exception of one of the triplets that was dead from lick.

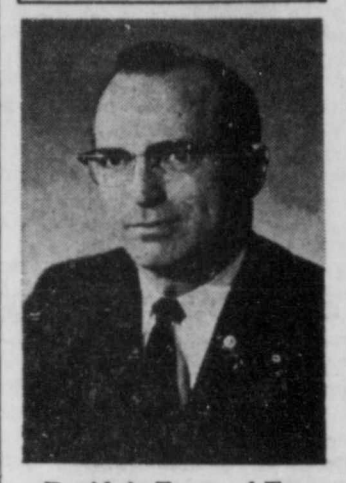
New Traffic Signal Lights Are Installed

Mills County Project Included In Highway Construction Contract

A contract for highway construction in the Brownwood District has been awarded by the Texas Highway Commission.

The work will be under the supervision of District Engineer E. M. Pritchard and will be in Eastland, Coleman, Mills and Brown Counties.

McElroy Transport Co. of Fort Worth was awarded a contract for seal coat and hot mix cold laid asphaltic concrete pavement on highway sections totaling 16 miles.

These included the following projects:
Eastland County, US 80, 0.946 miles from SH 206 Intersection to Avenue N in Cisco
Eastland County, US 80, 1.486 miles from Avenue A in Cisco

0.9 mile east of east city limits
Eastland County, US 80, 2.155 miles from FM Road 2461 to FM Road 101 in Ranger

Coleman County, US 84, 1.955 miles from near Post Street to near east city limit in Coleman

Mills County, US 183, 1.368 miles from US 84 to Loop 15 in Goldthwaite

Brown County, SH 279, 8.129 miles from 3.4 miles south of Cross Cut to Park Road 15.

B. R. Russell of Brownwood is the Highway Department engineer in charge of the project which will take an estimated 60 working days. Low bid was \$66,937.72.

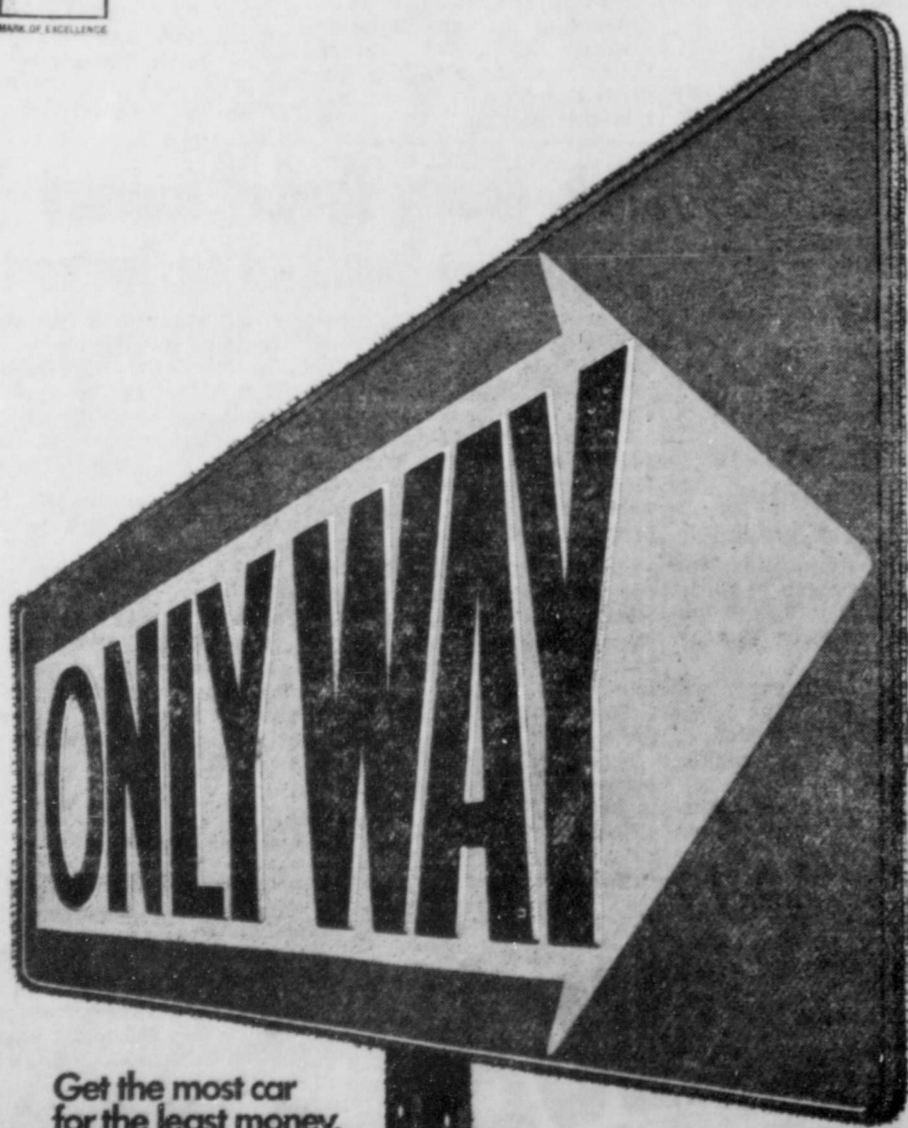

The bride's chosen colors of yellow and blue were carried out in beautiful floral arrangements and the refreshments.

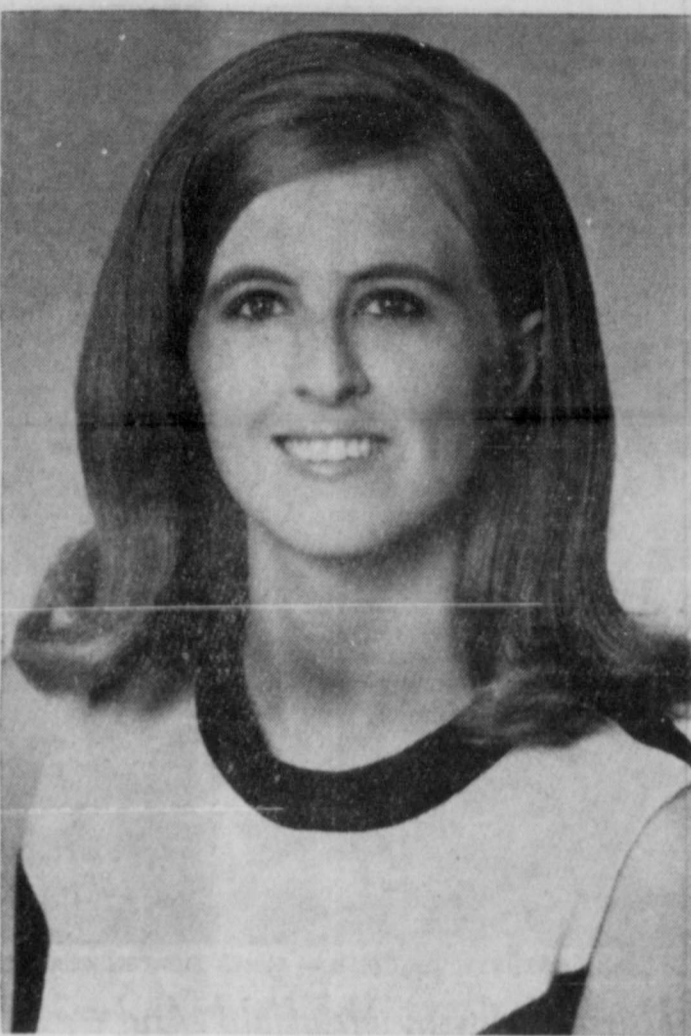

Social Security For Young People Who Are Disabled

Severely disabled young people will now find it easier to qualify for social security disability benefit payments, Glen McNatt, of the Brownwood Social Security Office, said today. A recent change in the law reduces the length of time the person must have worked before becoming disabled. One who becomes disabled before he is 24 years old must have worked under social security for at least 1½ years. If disability begins between the ages of 24 and 31, he must have worked the equivalent of half the time between age 21 and the date the disability began. The monthly benefit payments under this change cannot be paid for months before February 1968. Further information may be obtained from the Brownwood office, open Monday through Friday from 8:45 a. m. to 5 p. m. at 315 North Center St. Also, a representative of the office comes to Goldthwaite every other Thursday to the courthouse.

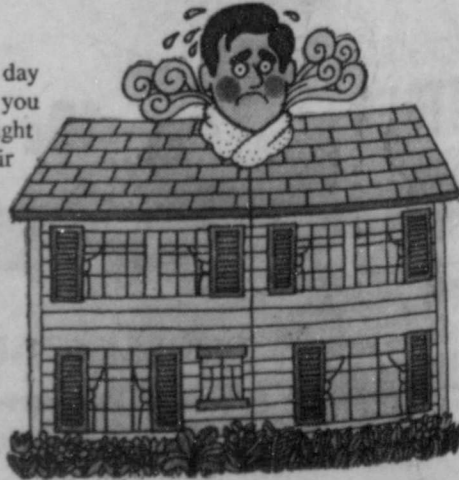
