The annual meeting was attended by approximately 120 members who heard progress report for the past year. They also heard report from Mr. McBride who spoke about REA service in general. Antlerless Deer Permits Will Be Issued Oct. 28-29

Antlerless deer permits for Mills County will be issued by the Texas Parks & Wildlife Department in Goldthwaite on Monday and Tuesday, October 28 and 29.

Benny R. Schriver, Game Management Officer for Mills County, announced Wednesday morning that the permits will be issued at the Courthouse on the two days from 8 a. m. to 5 p. m.

Landowners or their agents are urged to be present during the period scheduled for issuing such permits.

The Fighting Eagles brought home a whopping 41-18 victory from the Burnet Bulldogs Friday night, to take their first win of the season.

The Eagles are now preparing to meet the Bangs Dragons for their first district game this season. The district opener will be played at Bangs this Saturday night, October 18. Game time will be 7:30 p. m.

In commenting on the upcoming game, Eagle Coach Les Johnson stated, "Bangs is a big, strong team with experience, and they are rated by far the toughest team in the district. They also boast one of the dis-

trict's best running backs, Scott Pruett. It's a case of 'have to' for the Eagles now, and they are out to win."

This game will be Bangs' homecoming. Their season record is two wins and three losses. Cross Plains and Santa Anna will be opening 9-A District play Friday night.

The game against Burnet Friday night showed a 21-0 half-time lead for the Eagles, and a 41-6 lead at the end of the third quarter. Burnet came alive in the fourth quarter to add two more touchdowns, to end the game at 41-18.

Eagle Fullback Ted Roberts led the scoring attack for the Eagles, scoring five of Goldthwaite's six touchdowns. Quarterback Byron Harper accounted for the other TD and two extra points, and Richard Scott made three successful kicks for extra points.

Roberts led in yards rushing, gaining 234 yards on 25 carries. Halfback Joe Dan Hardgrave was the second leading rusher for the Eagles with 57 yards. The Bulldogs' leading rusher was quarterback Roy Smith, who gained 44 yards on 10 carries.

Roberts scored his first TD on a 37-yard run up the middle following a short Bulldog punt. Richard Scott's kick was good for the extra point, and less than a minute later Roberts went over from twelve yards out for his second tally, to set Scott up for his second PAT.

Kennon McLean made the first of his three interceptions on the Burnet 24 and returned it to the 12, to set the Eagles up for their third score of the evening. Five plays later, Roberts again scored, this time on a one-yard plunge. Scott made another good kick to make the score 21-0 at the half.

Early in the third quarter, the Eagles took possession after a short Bulldog punt, and pushed their way 41 yards down the field. Harper then scored on a four-yard run, but the extra point attempt failed. With two minutes left in the third quarter Roberts added another tally, a four-yard dive. Johnny Johnson passed to Harper for the two-point conversion.

Roberts then broke loose for his longest run of the night and another score. He sprinted 76 yards to finish off the Eagles' 41 points.

Mike Thompson scored two of Burnet's touchdowns, on runs of 80 and 15 yards. Smith scored on a 24-yard quarterback keeper. These three scores were made in the final thirteen minutes of the game. Thompson's first TD was a first for Burnet in two categories — it was the first one of the game, also the first of the season for the Bulldogs.

Coach Johnson made the following statement about the game, "Strong team effort is what really makes a winning team, and that is exactly what made the key difference against Burnet. Whenever one of our boys made a mistake, the others were there ready to fill in. The whole team was in there trying and it felt really good to win."

Johnson further stated that everyone on the squad saw quite a bit of action.

3500 Troops And 1500 Vehicles In Operation Iron Knight II Exercise

An exercise involving some 3,500 troops and 1,500 vehicles from Fort Hood which has been in the planning stages since July got underway Monday in an area including Mills County.

Iron Knight II will be III Corps and Ft. Hood's second off post command post exercise (CPX) since October 1967. The operation will be a five day map exercise ending October 18.

The area for the exercise will be bounded by the neighboring cities of Brownwood, Comanche, San Saba, Lampasas and Gatesville, according to announcement from Fort Hood.

This will be the first time since 1952 that the Army has

used this area for a command post exercise.

The main purpose of the exercise is to test the mobility and communication systems of the units involved under simulated combat conditions and over realistic distances.

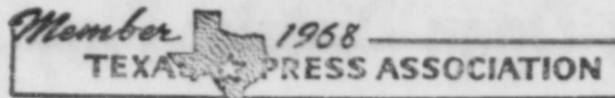

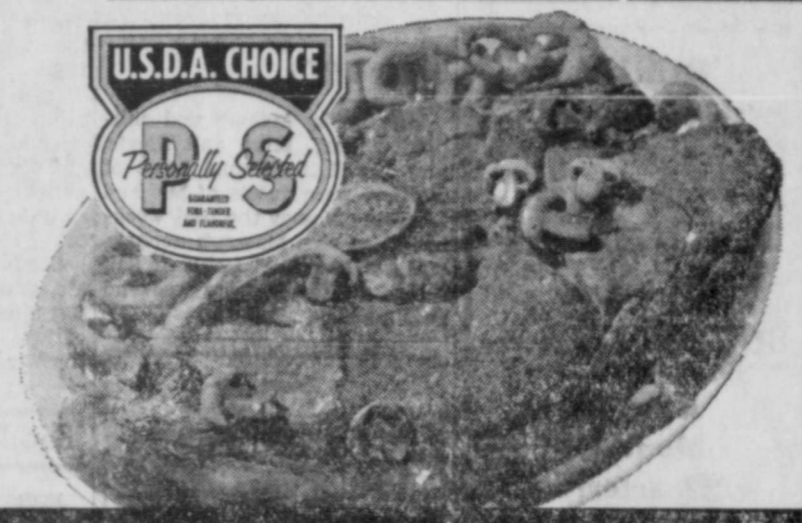
