As of last Friday, December 27, only 1,093 Mills County citizens had registered to vote in the forthcoming elections durng 1989, according to Brooks.

This is running behind regishad registered by December 29. Current registrations reflect less than one-half of the percentage of those who need to get registered in order to vote.

Mills County registered over 2,600 last year to vote. This leaves registrations to date about 1,500 short with only one






