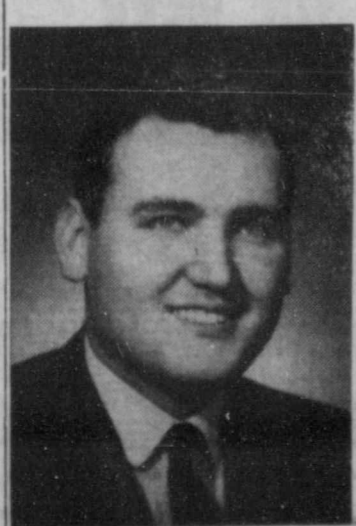
Assembly Of God Church Schedules Revival April 2-6

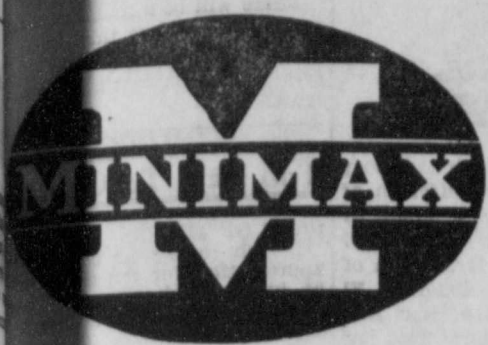

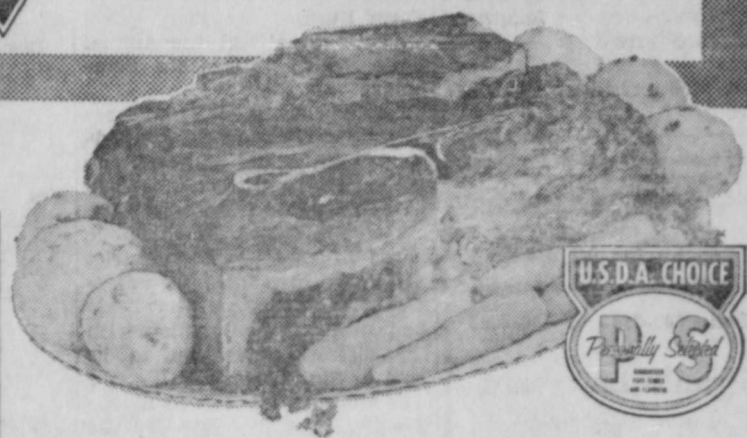

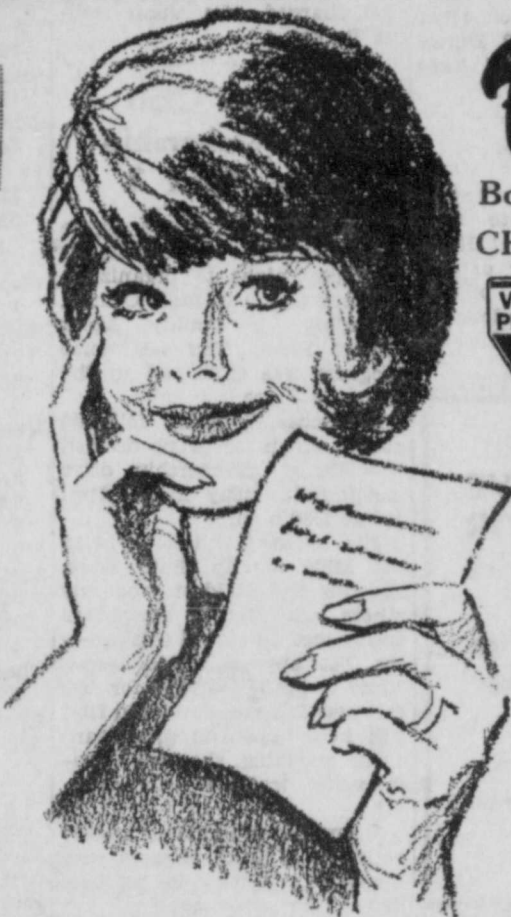

COURTS SPEAK

Texas Supreme Court has set a March 26 hearing on the suit challenging constitutionality of the state's Sunday closing law. Spartan's, Barker's, Shoppers World and Globe Stores won a verdict in San Antonio District court that the law is invalid.

High Court left in effect the decision of Amarillo Court of Civil Appeals that the "reasonable doubt" rule applying to adult criminal trials also must be adhered to in juvenile delinquency cases.

Supreme Court held that a district court jury or judge should pass on whether an Amarillo television broadcast improperly termed a Borger man a supermarket bandit. Suspect was freed before the broadcast on his arrest.

Electric company is not liable for punitive damages in the accidental electrocution of a young woman who was boating on Lake Jackson, Supreme Court ruled.

BILLS AND MORE BILLS

Chief clerk of the House and the secretary of the Senate both were deluged with more bills, many of them of statewide import.

Rep. Temple Dickson of Sweetwater wants to prohibit discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion or national origin by barber or beauty shops.

Sen. Ronald Bridges of Corpus Christi and Rep. James Nowlin of San Antonio dropped in separate bills lowering the voting age to 19, and Rep. Carlos Truan of Corpus Christi, Sen. Joe Bernal of San Antonio and Rep. Joe Allen of Baytown want to drop the age to 18.

A state board to regulate private trade schools was introduced by Rep. John Wright of Grand Prairie.

Fourteen senators are co-sponsoring a minimum-wage bill sponsored by Bernal, but 16 will be needed to pass the law and 21 to bring the bill up for a vote.

Measures toughening the dangerous-drugs laws were filed by Rep. Burke Musgrove of Breckenridge and Sen. Charles Herring of Austin.

Judges would not be able to grant probation to persons convicted of driving while intoxicated, under a bill by Rep. Glenn Kothmann of San Antonio. Those convicted would have to go to jail for at least three days.

Freshman Rep. John R. Bigham wants to add investment income of insurance companies to the factors considered when the state Board of Insurance sets auto-insurance premium rates.

Rep. Ace Pickens of Odessa will try once again to create Permian State College in the Midland-Odessa area. He introduced two bills—one putting it in Odessa and the other "in the Odessa-Midland area."

Oral confessions would be allowed in court under another Christie bill.

Governor Smith nominated Brig. Gen. Ross Ayers of Friona as adjutant general of Texas to succeed Maj. Gen. Thomas Bishop.

Smith also appointed Lester Boyd of Vernon and Leslie H. True of Dallas to State Board of Corrections and reappointed James M. Windham of Livingston to a new term.

Smith selected Dr. David Wade of Austin as director of comprehensive health planning for state.

Lieutenant Governor Barnes

named to the Youth Advisory Committee Andrew Jefferson of Houston, Judge Scott Moore of Fort Worth, Luster Gollaher of Dallas, Dr. Robert Rynearson of Temple, Dr. R. L. Deter of El Paso, Raul Garcia of San Antonio, Judge Arthur Tips of Wichita Falls, Larry Fultz of Houston and Judge Truman Roberts, Hamilton.

SHORT SNORTS

Governor Smith approved a contract by which Texas A&M and 11 other state agencies will make a four and one half year study of marine resources of the Gulf of Mexico.

Attorneys Jim Greenwood of Houston and Don Nobles of Austin are nominees for president-elect of State Junior Bar of Texas; Charles Bonniwell of Corpus Christi and Robert R. Sanders of Amarillo are vice-presidential nominees; and Joe D. Clayton of Tyler and Bob J. Surovik of Abilene are secretary-treasurer nominees.
