Election returns for school trustees in Goldthwaite, Mullin, Priddy and Star school districts and county board members were announced Tuesday by County Judge Cecil Egger.

School trustees were elected last Saturday.

In Star, Mullin and Priddy voting was about normal. In Goldthwaite voting was somewhat heavier with six candidates on the ballot for two places to be filled.

Two trustees were elected in each of the four districts for a regular three year term while two members were elected to the County School Board for a regular two year term.

### MULLIN

Deward Chesser was elected in Mullin while Denny Shelton and Dick Roberts polled a tie vote in the contest. Votes were cast as follows: Deward Chesser 28, Denny Shelton 16, Dick Roberts 16.

At a meeting of the school board Monday night Dick Roberts won the office by a flip of a coin to break the tie.

Before the tie was settled by the coin flip both Mr. Shelton and Mr. Roberts offered to withdraw in favor of his opponent.

### 2,056 Mills County Residents Are Registered To Vote In 1969

Voter registration for the 1969 elections as tabulated and officially released by H. G. Brooks, Mills County Sheriff, Tax Assessor and Collector, total 2,056.

The official list was completed the past week after some delay while tax office personnel gave the list of registrants the final check for duplications.

The number of voters that are qualified to vote in this year's elections represents a considerable decrease from last year when 2,627 had registered to vote.

Last year was the first year when everyone was required to register to vote and it brought out an unusually large number. It was also a presidential election year which usually creates more interest.

Only those who have registered and are actually listed on the official tally list will be allowed to vote.

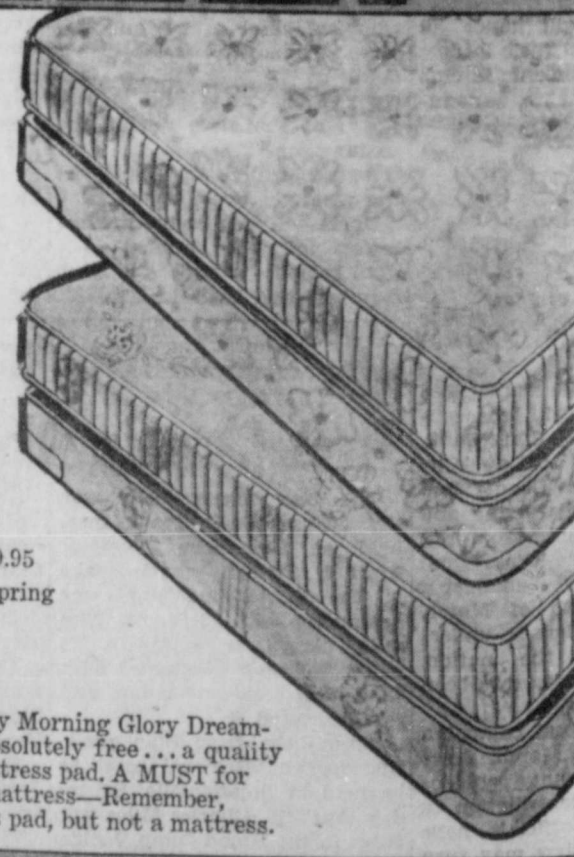

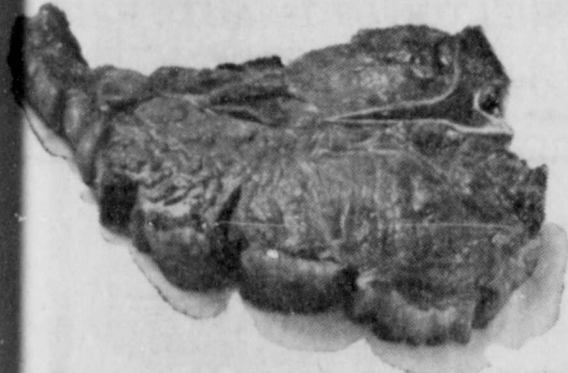

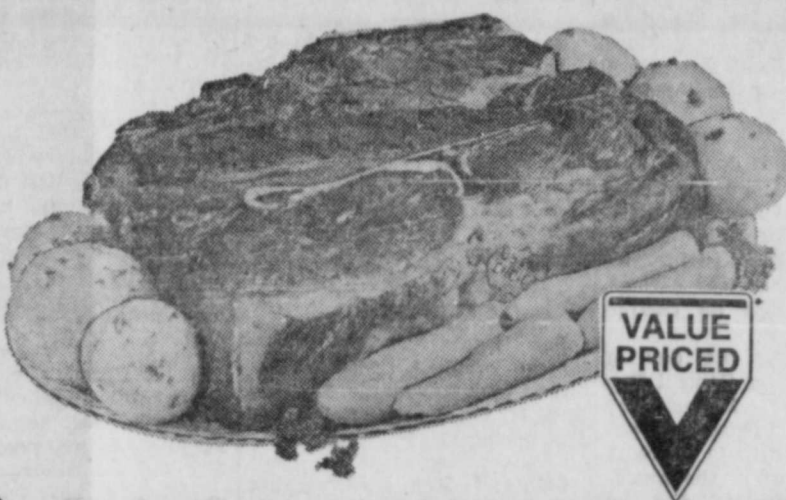
