The resignation, effective on July 15, was accepted with regret by the Board of Education of Goldthwaite Independent School District meeting in regular session Monday night.

Mr. Beard, superintendent here since 1962, has not announced his plans for the future.

TAX RATE IS REDUCED

The tax rate for 1969 on school assessments was approved by the board and reflects a reduction of 15¢ per \$100 of assessed valuation. The new rate is \$1.25 for local maintenance and 40¢ for bond indebtedness for a total of \$1.65. It was the bonded indebtedness that was reduced from .55 to 40 cents.
