Following are a few of the

areas involved in the additional budget requirements.

A new law passed by the Texas Legislature this year, provides for a \$750 average salary increase per teacher for 1969-70, and an additional raise in 1970-71. This means local revenue requirements have been increased by the State.

An accreditation visit in 1968 by the TEA showed some deficiencies relating to room lighting and general building repair and custodial service.

A corrective lighting project was started last year and must be finished this year. New windows were installed in seven rooms of the high school last year and the balance must be completed this year.

The high school building is a sound building but requires proper maintenance, which has long been neglected due to lack of funds, and must have better custodial care.

This school has paid \$150 per month for an elementary custodian, which only allows six school employees, except teachimum wage scales.

Last year the lunchroom program was not self-sustaining and had to be subsidized by about \$1.750.00. Every effort will be put forth this year to eliminate this expense through efficiency and the possibility of a small increase in the price of

In commenting on the budget requirements, school board officials issued the following state-

ment: "We want the public to be informed about their school system. We want them to know where every tax dollar collected is spent, and that the most value possible is obtained from it. We believe our first concern must be an academic responsibility to the children. We know we have a good school plant expect us to ask for enough money to provide a regular schedule of building mainten-

ance. "Taxes are not a popular topic and many times it is hard to see the real value received from taxes for the thought of how much one has to pay. Increased taxes work hardships on many just as any increase in any cost does. Many people already have their children through school or do not have children. Others feel they do not have an equal tax with their neighbors or have to pay more than is needed to operate their school. The cost of education per student is over \$500 per year. If a child goes 12 years that means someone must pay \$6,000 for this education.

"Goldthwaite does not have much industry but it can produce one commodity that the community can be justly proud of, and that is an educated young person.

"We have had outstanding athletic programs and many of our students have received scholarships to help them through college. Our FFA and FHA programs have been among the best in the state. These are some of the things our town is judged by. Our children will know when we are really interested in our school programs, school buildings and

equipment and the upkeep." A copy of the budget and comparative statements pertaining to the necessary evaluations and tax rates will be made available to the public when details are worked out in final form, according to announce-



Special Session Opens Monday As Legislators Tackle Finances

By VERN SANFORD Texas Press Association

AUSTIN Tex. - It starts all ver again Monday (July 28). Legislators will be back at the capitol, finishing up the finance chores they left dangling in their regular session

Gov. Preston Smith, who called the special session after he rejected lawmakers' no - tax one-year budget and insisted on adoption of a balanced biennial appropriations bill, apparently will spell out his recommendations on opening day.

Smith has been conducting series of talks with business and industry leaders, exploring tax ideas. Legislators are expected to have to come up with a revenue measure totalling \$300 million or more.

Governor abandoned the idea of waiting until after the August 5 vote on an \$80 million welfare spending limit and oth er proposed constitutional amendments. Advisors and legis lative leaders told him lawmakers will need every one of the session to complete the big money job at hand.

Key legislative leaders have ione some spadework on a \$5.6 billion two-year budget for the fiscal period extending through August 31, 1971. No major difficulties are anticipated here although some hitches could develop.


