## Expansion Of Sewer System Moves Step Closer To Reality

Expansion of the city's sewer system to serve residents in areas that it has not reached in the past moved a step closer to reality during the past two weeks, as the city council and engineer have taken a new look at the picture.

At the last meeting of the

council it was decided to re-check the entire situation and bring past studies up to date. The council asked City Manager W. C. Barnett to contact Engineer Bob King to come in and for the two to go over past surveys and to recheck needs and cost figures.

The City Council had a special meeting last Thursday noon when members were brought up to date through a briefing by Manager Barnett on their findings and what may be done to

solve the most pressing needs in expanding the sewer system.

The tentative proposal presented to the council would be for the city to begin sewer improvements on a pay as you go basis with customers sharing a small part of the cost and without a property tax increase.

Included as part of the program would be an increase in sewer service charges and garbage fees. These two items are considered long overdue and have been discussed a number of times by the council since the amount collected for these services has been only about one-half the amount it costs the city to do the job.

The proposal presented for study by the council and citizens of the town covers three projects to be done over a two year period and costing an estimated \$50,000.

Funds to pay for the work would come from available sewer funds, electric funds, cost share connection charges from customers, increase in sewer rates and garbage collection fees.

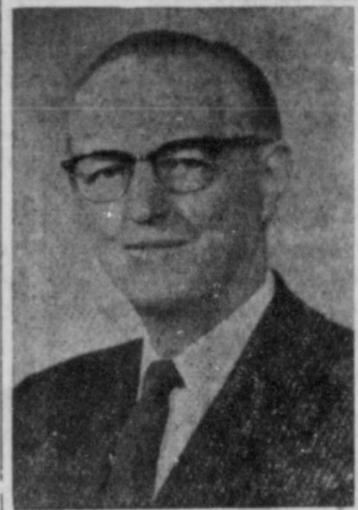
Projects and areas were selected on the most pressing need and to give service to the most families. The three include: 1—Alley between East Front Street and Lynch Street; 2—Proctor Drive and Live Oak Street System; (this would not include Hannah Valley Road at this time, which could be added at a later date); and 3—Pine and Maple Street System. Number two and three are both located in the Northwest area of the city where the need has been the most pressing.

It was pointed out that these three areas would be undertaken first because of the need and that other areas would enter into the planning for future additions to the system with the city continuing the expansion on the same pay as you go basis.

More definite details with more accurate cost figures will be presented to the council at the next regular meeting of the group on October 6 when a report will be presented by the engineer.

In the meantime residents of the areas covered in the proposals and all citizens of Goldthwaite are invited to express their views to members of the council or the city manager and to ask any questions that they may have regarding the matter.
