Lions Club Eagle Relays Scheduled To Be Held Here Saturday, April 4

Plans were announced this week for the annual Lions Club Eagle Relays to be held at the Goldthwaite school track field next Saturday, April 4.

Coach Leslie Johnson has stated that invitations have been sent out to a large number of schools and a record number of entries is expected again this year.

The Lions Club will be sponsoring this event again this year. Plans have been made to give the nicest trophies and medals that any meet could ask for, as well as extra medals for outstanding boys in certain events combined, Coach Johnson stated.

Seventeen schools had entered by last Tuesday and Coach Johnson said he is expecting the list to grow before the deadline next Wednesday, April 1.

The field events will get underway at 9:30 a. m. on Saturday morning and the meet will be concluded on Saturday afternoon at 4:15 p. m., when championship trophies will be awarded by the president of the Lions Club, Hollis Wiggins.

Trophies to be awarded during the meet are now on display at D-BAR-T Western Wear, where they may be inspected by anyone interested in the meet.

40 YEARS AGO—

The county meet to be held here today and tomorrow is expected to attract a good many entries and contestants, if the disagreeable weather abates. Many of the schools of the county have held their preliminary contests and will be represented, in all probability.

The proclamation of Mayor Bodkin should be of interest to every citizen of the town and all should give hearty cooperation in the campaign to make this one of the cleanest and most beautiful towns in Texas.

A meeting of a representative of the Federal Farm Board and

the leading poultry men and representatives of the cooperative marketing associations in this section will be held Thursday, April 3. This is to be an executive meeting of the leaders and heads of the departments over the poultry raising section.

Some weeks ago a form of eruption appeared in this city and while few, if any, suffered or were seriously inconvenienced by it, a great majority of the citizens became alarmed

and more than 900 of them were vaccinated. This is believed to be a record for vaccination, where practically one-half of the citizens were vaccinated at one time.

Late Tuesday afternoon the Weston ranch home, three miles south of town, was burned. Mrs. Weston and daughters were at home and heard a noise overhead. They ran outside and discovered the roof was on fire. A boy was plowing nearby and they made a desperate effort to

save the house, but before help from other farms or town could arrive, the wind had increased the flames and house and contents were lost.—Mullin News.
