

Sgt. Richard F. Heath Dies In Japan From Vietnam War Injuries

Sergeant Richard F. Heath, 22, of Goldthwaite died at 2:30 a. m. Monday, April 13 in an American hospital in Japan from wounds he received by mortar fire near the Cambodian border on Friday, April 3.

Sgt. Heath, who had served voluntarily in Vietnam for over three years, was a member of the First Cavalry Division and a technical inspector for Army helicopters. He was a 1966 graduate of Goldthwaite High School and enlisted in the army shortly after graduation.

Two members of the advisory board of the National Guard unit stationed at Brownwood and Sheriff H. G. Brooks notified the family of the sergeant's death Monday.

The sergeant's body will be shipped home on the first available air lift to a local port where Roy Wilkins Funeral Home will take charge of arrangements.

Survivors include his parents, Mr. and Mrs. M. L. Heath of

Goldthwaite Teams Claim District 9-A Track And Field Crown Saturday

The Goldthwaite Eagles stacked up six first places and qualified both relay teams for regional competition here Saturday afternoon to win the District 9-A track and field crown.

The Eagles wound up 160 points to 121 1/2 for the runner-up Bangs Dragons. Following the leaders were Cross Plains with 83 1/2, Santa Anna with 46 and Early with 33.

Goldthwaite also won the freshman division with 190 1/2 points and the junior high division with 139 points.

Kennon McLean of Goldthwaite emerged as the meet's high-pointed, winning both the broad jump and high jump as well as running legs on the two Eagle relay teams.

Other double winners were Goldthwaite's Joe Dan Hardgrave, who bested the field in 100 and 220-yard dashes, Joe Dadds of Cross Plains, who won the 120-yard high hurdles and the pole vault, and Leslie Cowan, winner in both the shot put and the discus throw.

Following Goldthwaite in the freshman division were Cross Plains, 108; Santa Anna, 95; Bangs, 46 1/2; and Early, 2. Others in the junior high meet were Bangs 122 1/2; Cross Plains, 92; Santa Anna, 67, and Early, 64 1/2.

Election Returns Certified As New City Officials Take Office

Newly elected city officials took their oath of office Monday night during the regular meeting of the city council at the City Hall.

Three new aldermen were sworn into office after being declared elected when the council canvassed and declared results from the April 7 election.

The three newly elected officials taking office for another term are: E. R. Bruce, Lester Geeslin and Hollis Wiggins. They all three received 32 votes in the unusually light voter turnout.

Holdover members of the city official family are Mayor Ray Duren, and Aldermen Carl Lettetter and Harvey Parker.

Before the newly elected aldermen took office members of the council heard monthly operating reports from City Manager W. C. Barnett covering receipts and disbursements for the various departments for the month of March. They also approved quarterly treasurer's report.

Members of the council were paid for the past year.

Barnett reported to the council on work projects including the electric department and the sewer improvement and expansion program.

District Highway Engineer E. M. Pritchard appeared before the council to talk about traffic lights in the city limits. Some residents had expressed a desire for more traffic lights. Mr. Pritchard pointed out to the council that the present traffic light maintained at the corner of Fisher and Fourth streets in Goldthwaite is illegal according to Texas Highway Department and National Safety standards.

The group also discussed the problems of people parking their vehicles on corners at no parking zones.

Ninety books were donated to the Prison Library at Huntsville. The remainder of books were given to the local public school.

Several years later the Art and Civic Club proposed a plan for all the clubs of the town to cooperate in the beginning of a new library. This time it was started in the Courthouse with Mrs. Addie Schooler as librarian. This was continued until 1950 when the Jennie Trent Dew Library was opened. The Self Culture Club was responsible for the beginning of a public library in Goldthwaite.

Mrs. Fred Reynolds was program leader for the afternoon. Invocation was given by Mrs. Reynolds. A travelogue was presented by Mr. and Mrs. Lee Walton with their beautiful pictures which took the members to all parts of the United States. The club was happy to have the Waltons share their pictures with them, and everyone enjoyed the program.

Cake and coffee was served to 20 members and two guests.

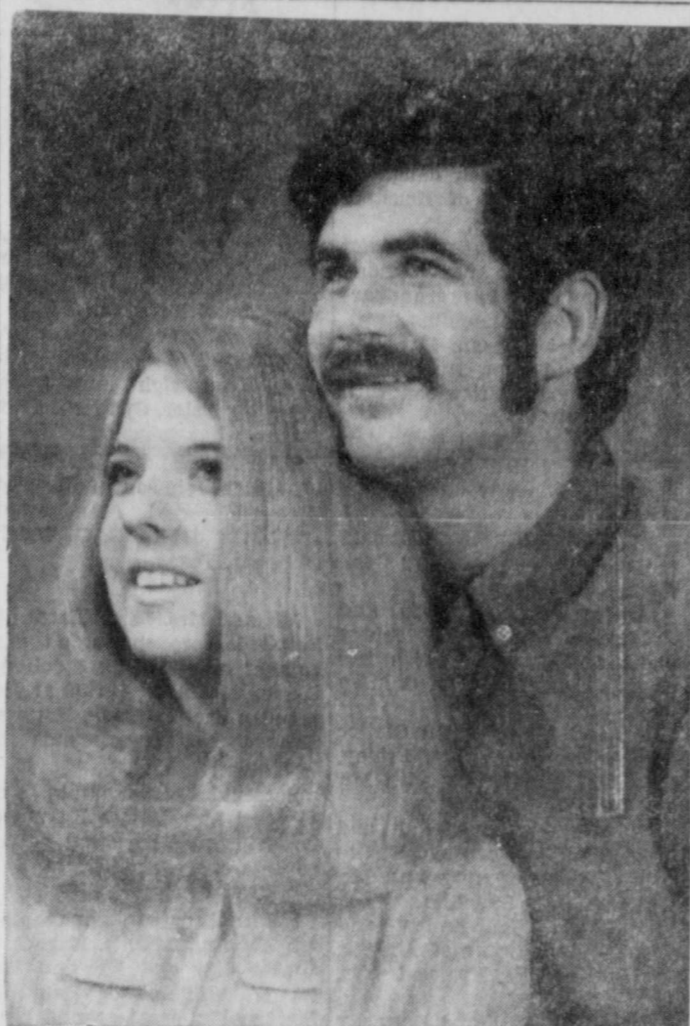
